

Cockfighting Broken Up

ALBANY — (UP)—Five men were arrested Sunday when state police and Deputy Sheriff George Miller walked in on a cockfight near Sodaville about 20 miles northeast of here.

Miller identified the men as Carl Vernon Bridges, 35, owner of the farm; Aubrey Alexander, 51, Sweet Home; Percy Bush, 40, Foster; Kenneth Childs, 49, Lebanon; and Thomas Matthews, 42, Salem.

District Attorney Courtney Johns said there was no law specifically prohibiting the fights, but charged the men with "committing an act which grossly outrages public decency and is injurious to public morals."

The men appeared in justice court Monday afternoon, and the case was continued to Jan. 25.

Miller said the 14th fight of the day was underway when officers arrived.

Springfield to Honor 'Citizen'

Speculation is increasing in Springfield as to who will be named Citizen of the Year Jan. 21 when the Chamber of Commerce holds its annual meeting in Springfield Memorial Bldg.

A chamber committee has selected the citizen who will be honored at a banquet beginning at 7 p.m. Program Chairman Virgil Parker III has announced Guy Leonard of the Portland Chamber will be guest speaker. Other events include entertainment, submission of the annual report by Chamber Manager Oliver Larson, installation of President-elect Fred Buell, and an outline of prospects for 1952.

The banquet tickets will sell for \$1.50. No reservation is necessary.

Commutation Again Asked For Wilsons

PORTLAND — (UP)—Attorneys for convicted murderers Turman and Utah Wilson Monday again asked Gov. Arthur B. Lange of Washington to commute the death sentence against the brothers.

The request was prompted by issuance Monday of a six-page booklet, "The Truth about the Case of Turman and Utah Wilson," which attorneys for the Wilson brothers said was written "in response to the numerous requests for information we received from people throughout the Pacific Northwest."

The booklet outlines events leading up to the trial in Clark County Superior Court in June, 1950, and subsequent conviction of the Wilson brothers for the first degree murder of 18-year-old Joann Dewey of Meadowdale, Wash.

The Wilson brothers were granted a stay of execution by the U.S. Supreme Court last month on petition of defense attorneys for a writ of review. The attorneys have 30 days from Dec. 1 to submit briefs to the court.

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Solons Too Old, Neuberger Says

'Young Legislators Needed in Oregon'

PENDLETON — (P)—State Sen. Richard L. Neuberger, who became 39 last month, thinks the Oregon Legislature is made up of too many old men.

Neuberger, a Portland Democrat, told the First Citizen banquet here Monday night that the old men should retire and let younger men take over the reins of government.

Neuberger criticized other features of the state government.

'Favor Gamblers'

He said the Pendleton Roundup Association and the Pacific International Livestock Exposition are being forced by the Legislature to support laws favorable to gamblers.

He said the two organizations received money from pari-mutuel dog and horse racing revenues. This forces them to support legislation favorable to race tracks, he said.

Radioman Honored

Neuberger also called for the State Legislature to put the State Tax Commission under Civil Service. The three commissioners now are appointed by the governor.

Vehicles Major Cause of Death By Violence in Lane County

Vehicular fatalities again "led the league" in 1950 here in Lane County, according to Coroner Fred Buell.

Of the total of 167 investigation made last year by the coroner's office, 45 were caused by vehicles, Buell said.

And of this 45, ten died in one-car accidents, nine in two-car accidents and nine in auto-pedestrian accidents; auto-truck collisions killed six; truck-truck collisions killed six; truck-pedestrian, two; auto-bicycle, two; auto-train, two; truck-train, one; auto-bus, three. One person was crushed by a truck.

The year's total included 15 drownings, 12 logging deaths, 15 suicides, 5 deaths from falling and 5 accidental gunshot fatalities, 3 construction deaths, and 3 each of electrocution, burn, and airplane crash causes.

One fatal industrial accident, one death by poison, and one train-pedestrian death were listed. The report also included one slaying, as yet unsolved, when a man died in Eugene as the result of being hit with a bottle.

Federation of Labor Offers Scholarships

PORTLAND — (P)—The Oregon State Federation of Labor will present \$500 college scholarships to five high school students.

Winners will be selected from those placing highest in a test on history of the labor movement, union officials announced Monday. High school principals will be notified of details of the scholarships.

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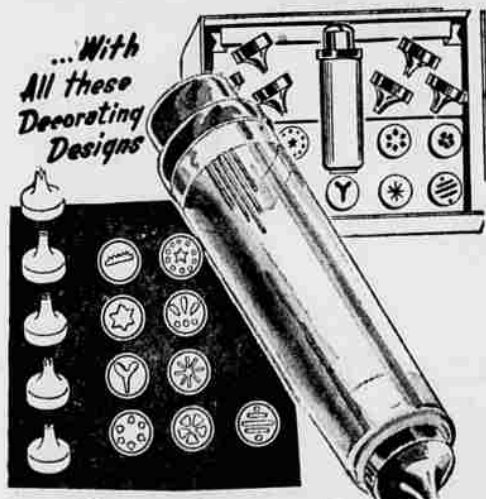
