As she turned she was pelted with eggs. Police saw the residual evidence on the porch when they were called Thursday.

They left with the name of the frustrated young man, planning to let juvenile authorities take any action the case might demand.

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Second Charge Of Murder Filed

Autopsy Supports Killer's Confession

MOUNT VERNON, Wash.—(UP)—A second charge of first degree murder was on file Friday against Harold Chase, 22, who two weeks ago spoiled three "perfect crimes" by confessing.

Prosecutor Reuben Youngquist charged Chase with the murder of Leonard Lewis, who died in January, 1949, in the Northern State Hospital.

Listed As Suicide
Chase earlier had been charged with killing Dr. Russell Bradley, Everett optometrist.

The new charge was filed in Skagit County after an autopsy by Dr. Gale Wilson, Seattle pathologist, showed Lewis died of strangulation from a fracture of the thyroid cartilage of the larynx.

"I have never seen such a fracture without a direct blow to the larynx," Dr. Wilson said.

Lewis' death had been listed as suicide.

3rd Death Mystery
Chase has confessed to three killings police never knew had been committed, and one still is a matter for speculation.

Chase identified his third victim only as a San Francisco French teacher named "Joe." He said he hit "Joe" on the head with a bottle and then threw his body off a cliff in San Francisco last September or October. Police, however, have not been able to find any record of a death fitting the story.

Forger Draws 4-Year Sentence From Court
Congo-born Paul Kopp, 26, was sentenced to four years in the penitentiary for forgery Thursday in Circuit Court.

Kopp, who lives in Reno now, entered a plea of guilty when charged with forging some \$80 worth of checks together with a Eugene man. He had applied for probation through his attorney.

Also in Circuit Court, Richard Elroy Jenkins, 19, of Tillamook, was charged with grand larceny.

Police Probe Blow on Head

Eugene police Thursday were investigating a case of attempted robbery by force. The victim, Raymond J. Kerr of Vida, was found on the sidewalk in front of 1048 W. Broadway at 1:08 a.m., his face covered with blood.

Kerr told officers that someone had stepped from the shadows and hit him, then tried to take his wallet.

Failing to get the wallet, his assailant fled on foot, Kerr said, running east along Broadway.

Kerr was being treated at Sacred Heart Hospital Friday for jaw injuries. His condition was good.

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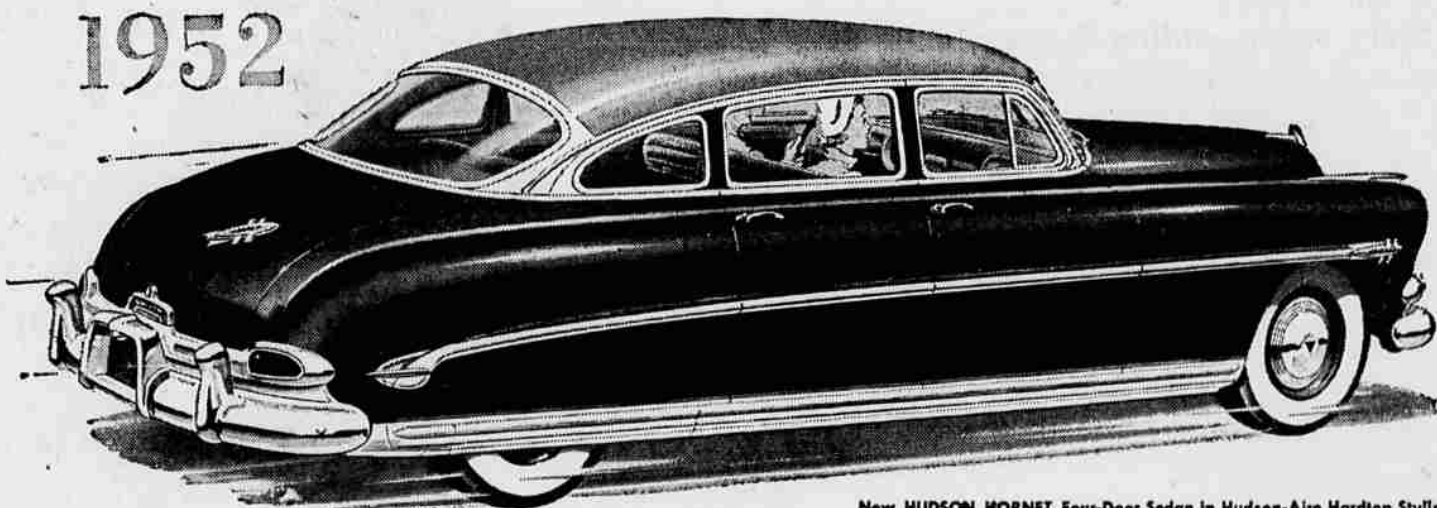
