West Germany Club Topic

COTTAGE GROVE — Virgil Kingsley, superintendent of the Kingsley school district here, Thursday discussed problems of Western Germany for members of the Lions Club.

Kingsley, a club member, said information on the subject was obtained from two German exchange students now studying at the University of Oregon.

Western Germany has made a strong comeback since World War II, especially in the field of industry, Kingsley said, mainly through efforts of the United States.

He said the people are now eating as well, if not better, than those in England.

In case of war between the United States and Russia, Kingsley said, the German exchange students feel there is no question Western Germans will support the democracies.

Savings Group Tallies Gains

16 Per Cent Boost
Noted in Year

Increases in the surplus and general reserves were reported to members of the First Federal Savings and Loan Assn. of Eugene this week by Manager E. T. Stelle.

At their annual meeting, Stelle told the members that undivided profits and reserves were increased 16 per cent in 1951 over 1950, after paying the association's customary dividend of 2½ per cent to savers.

He reported the Eugene institution now has surplus and reserve which is among the highest, percentage wise, of any similar institution in the state.

Three of the directors, all of Eugene, were re-elected to serve for another three-year term. They are O. K. Burrell, president, Worth Harvey, and Stelle. Other directors are F. B. Harlow, Donald R. Husband, C. R. Manerud and E. I. Pitkin.

Burrell told the members the local institution may be unique in that it has never owned any real estate nor taken over any borrower's home.

He credited this record in part to the policy of the association to refuse to assist home-buyers or builders "who appear to be over-extending their resources in their home-financing program."

Grove Chamber to Propose Changes in Highway Plans

COTTAGE GROVE—A Chamber of Commerce proposal for two access roads to the city when Highway 99 is relocated may be submitted to the State Highway Commission next week.

William Hesse, member of a special Chamber committee, said Thursday the committee hopes to discuss the matter with the commission shortly — maybe next week. Hesse said the committee at present is collecting information that will show the need for two access roads.

In a recent traffic count, Hesse said, 11,000 vehicles traveled on East Main St. in a 62 hour period. This was almost entirely local traffic, he added.

The highway commission has already outlined a tentative plan for the Cottage Grove area when Highway 99 is relocated just east of the city limits.

This plan calls for construction of a cloverleaf on East Main St. and a partial cloverleaf at Divide
