

Uni High Offense Clicks Tiders Top Willamette 61-37, Move to Third-Place Tie

Winners Enjoy 32-21 Margin At Intermission

MOSCOW, Ida.—(UPI)—Hartley Kruger, 6-foot, 7½-inch University of Idaho center, pushed through a hook shot in the last minute and a half of play Friday night to give the Vandals a shaky 65-64 Northern Division basketball victory over Oregon State College.

Kruger's shot came only a few seconds after Beaver center Bob Edwards converted a free throw to put Oregon State ahead, 64-63.

Gunnar Christiansen opened the contest by hitting a freethrow for Willamette.

Al Gubrud, Tider forward, soloed in for a cripple five seconds later to put his team ahead 2-1.

Two quick goals, and Pierce converted a charity shot, running the lead to 11-5.

Gubrud's two outside shots helped the Tiders hold this six-point lead, 18-12, at the quarter.

EARLY LEAD
Idaho got off to an early lead and held a 32-21 halftime margin after dominating the first period. But with five minutes gone in the third quarter OSC staged a rally that brought it to the heels of the
