Seminary Needs Noted by Church

Attention of Episcopal churches in Oregon will be directed Sunday, Jan. 27, to the Church Divinity School of the Pacific, in Berkeley, Calif., the only Episcopal seminary west of the Mississippi River. Presiding Bishop Henry Knox Sherrill has designated the day as Theological Education Sunday, and parishes and lay people are asked to give offerings for the financial support of their seminaries.

MEN FROM Oregon who are attending the Church Divinity School of the Pacific include: Lauren H. McReynolds, Toledo; Walter Parker, Corvallis; Wallace Bradley, Portland; Loren Bush, Eugene; John E. Easton, Eugene; Robert Burton, Roseburg; and John Shidler, McMinnville.

Dean Sherman E. Johnson of the Church Divinity School of the Pacific, outlining the objectives of Theological Education Sunday, with particular emphasis on seminary development in the West, declared that the Episcopal Church has had a shortage of clergy for several years.

"Since World War II," Dean Johnson said, "large numbers of able men have come knocking at the doors of the theological seminaries. The Church Divinity School of the Pacific suddenly jumped its enrollment from 20 students to 40, then to 60, and finally to 85."

More on Clark Appointment

At the monthly business meeting this week, the Eugene Friends Meeting approved the following statement on Representation at the Vatican:

"The Executive Committee of Friends General Conference wishes to record its opposition to the proposal made by President Truman to appoint an ambassador from the United States to the Vatican."

"We believe this to be a violation of the fundamental policy of our nation from the beginning of its history. It would give recognition to one particular church as a political power."

"Such discrimination is contrary to our most deeply rooted convictions; no religious group should be given a preference over any other. The American tradition of assuring freedom for all religions and of giving political recognition to none is a valuable part of our heritage."

"It is already apparent that this proposal has caused great tension between religious bodies in this country when we should be fostering fellowship between peoples of different faiths."

WE ADD our voice to others in pointing out the dangers in this step. It leads down the road to clericalism—the pursuit of power by a religious hierarchy. We believe in the free man in the free society and we desire to live in peace and unity with all Christians and those of other faiths.

"We are also deeply concerned that the reasons given for this proposal will increase the tension between East and West, which is the main obstacle to the achievement of world peace. The actions of our government should be in the direction of reducing this ill will in order to bring to an end the threat implicit in the armament race."

"This proposal is contrary to our national and international interests and to the fundamental concepts of religious freedom and world brotherhood."

Copies of the statement with an indication of local approval will be forwarded to President Truman and Senator Tom Connally, chairman Foreign Relations Committee of the U.S. Senate.

Episcopal-Lutheran Program Presented On 'Church of Air'

Dr. John R. Wyatt, minister of Trinity Episcopal Church, Seattle, will conduct the first half of CBS Radio's "Church of the Air" Sunday, Jan. 27 (KERG-CBS Radio, 7:00-7:30 a.m., PST). He speaks on a program presented in connection with National Youth Week by the United Christian Youth Action. Music for the program will be sung by a 40-member choir of Trinity Episcopal Church, directed and accompanied by Eugene M. Nye.

The Rev. Joseph M. Girtz, pastor of Trinity Lutheran Church, Albert Lea, Minn., will speak on the text "You Are My Witness" on the second half of "Church of the Air" 7:30-8 a.m. The program is presented in connection with a conference on evangelism held by the Lutheran Churches of Minnesota. Music by Mozart, Handel, Beethoven and Bach will be sung by the Trinity Lutheran Church Choir, directed by Mrs. Selmer Olson. Miss Phalvie Mortenson will accompany on the organ.

The Rev. George E. McDonough Accepts Pulpit of Unitarians

The Rev. George E. McDonough has accepted the invitation of the Unitarian Church to be its minister, beginning March 1, succeeding the Rev. Sidney Peterman.

McDonough is from San Francisco, where he has been during the past year assistant minister of the San Francisco Unitarian Church. He was born in Bridgeport, Conn., in 1924, and attended Middlebury College in Vermont, enlisted man, 1943-46. During part of this time, he was assistant to an Army chaplain. He was connected with Woods Hole Oceanographic Institution from March, 1946, to September, 1946, and was sent as an oceanographer to the atomic bomb tests at Bikini Atoll.

In September, 1946, he enrolled at the University of California and he received his Bachelor of Arts degree there in 1949, having majored in English and Psychology. He was an English instructor at Johns Hopkins University, 1949-50 and received his Master of Arts degree from that institution. In the fall semester of 1950 he was an instructor in the Philosophy of Language at the Starr King School of the Ministry, in Berkeley, Calif., where he received his Bachelor of Divinity degree.

Brotherhood Week Plans Start With Appointing of McConnell

Joseph H. McConnell, president of the National Broadcasting Company, has been named national chairman of the Radio-TV Committee for Brotherhood Week, to be observed Feb. 17-24 under the sponsorship of the National Conference of Christians and Jews.

The announcement of the appointment was made yesterday (Sat., Jan. 26) by Eric Johnston, president of the Motion Picture Association of America and general chairman of Brotherhood Week.

Mr. McConnell will head a committee of 75 radio and television executives representing networks, professional associations, unions and stations throughout the country who will mobilize the broadcasting industry cooperation for the observance.

In his statement of acceptance, Mr. McConnell reaffirmed the industry's responsibility to the nation's effort to combat bigotry.

First Christian Has Reports on Successful 1951

Two New Churches Start Their Careers

The First Christian Church of Eugene, Dr. Carroll C. Roberts, Pastor, at its annual meeting this week, reported the best year in the history of the congregation.

Earl Harter, chairman of the church board for 1951, presided as the report was made by Ross J. Griffith for the church. Total of 385 persons took membership with the church during the year, bringing the total church membership to 2173 on Jan. 1, 1952.

TOTAL FUND raised by the congregation for all causes exceeded \$83,000. Approximately \$37,000 of this amount was given to missions and benevolence, the remainder being for local expenses.

During the past year Eugene First Christian Church established two new congregations, one at College Crest and one at Allison Park. Otto Crumroy took the active leadership in this work.

The missionary projects included the support of two missionaries in training as well as the support of a missionary station in the Belgian Congo, Africa.

UNDER THE leadership of James H. Cornett, Associate Minister and Lynette Rhay, Director of Children's Work, the Bible School was able to carry forward many advances in teaching methods and equipment.

Harold Johnson, Jr. took over the chairmanship of the official board of the church and will serve during 1952. Prof. Ward A. Rice spoke on "Evaluating a Year's Program of the Church."

The First Christian Church voted to cancel a loan of \$2700 to the West Side Christian Church in order to enable that congregation, under the leadership of Wm. Richardson, to continue an expansion program unhindered by debt.
