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Morse Tells Why He Supports Ike

WASHINGTON — Sen. Wayne Morse is supporting Gen. Dwight Eisenhower for the Republican presidential nomination for four basic reasons, but chiefly because "we need a man with whom we can win."

In a televised Town Hall debate with Sen. Owen Brewster (R-Me) on the question, "Eisenhower or Taft—What are their chances?" Morse declared:

"IT IS SO important that we defeat the Democratic Administration that I think we Republicans will make a serious mistake if we do not select a man with whom we are sure we can win."

The second reason, said Morse, is the need for a man who can "unite our people and renew their faith in the future of America. I think four years under either Truman or Taft would create such a disunity on our country that we would be involved in a serious class-conscious conflict."

Morse gave as his third reason for backing Eisenhower his belief that "we need a president who can maintain our prestige abroad and develop a sound program of mutual security among our allies."

ON DOMESTIC issues, Morse believes Eisenhower to be a conservative, but "a very open-minded conservative." The Oregon senator said he thinks this an important consideration because "for the next four years we need a man whose domestic issues are either in the middle of the road or slightly right of center."

Morse dismissed fears of the general's military background by saying, "I have seen him many times before the Armed Services Committee and have come to form a very high regard for his intelligence, ability and integrity."

As for Eisenhower's chances, Morse is confident that "a groundswell" of public sentiment for the

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Truman Holds Power Parley

WASHINGTON —(AP)—Public power problems in the Northwest were discussed Monday by President Truman in a meeting with three members of Congress from Washington state and Herschel D. Newsom, master of the National Grange.

Sen. Warren G. Magnuson (D-Wash.), Rep. Hugh B. Mitchell (D-Wash.) and Rep. Henry M. Jackson (D-Wash.) brought Mr. Truman up to date on a possible difficulty in transferring stock from private to public utilities because of voluntary credit restraints of the Federal Reserve Board.

Magnuson said the principal purpose of the call was to give the President and his counsel, Charles S. Murphy, a background picture looking to the development of future policy.

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
