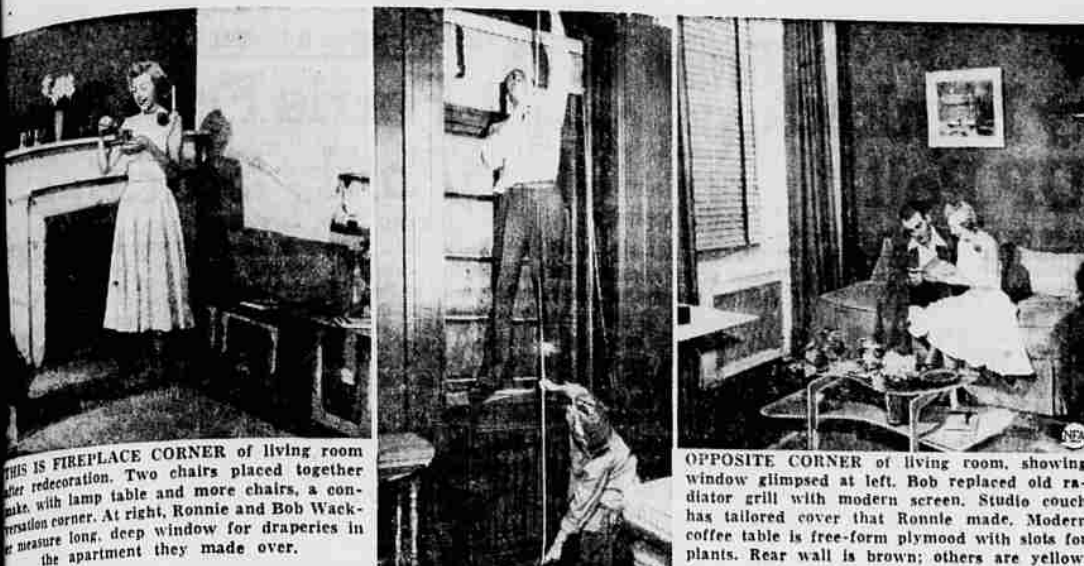

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Cheese Perks Up 'Left-Over Lunch'

If you've planned a "left-over lunch," there's nothing quite like a creamy-rich cheese sauce to perk up last night's vegetables or potatoes. When it's for you alone, combine about half a cup of processed cheese food with three ts. milk in the top of a double boiler, add the vegetables or potatoes, and you've the basis for a quickly-made and hearty luncheon.

Cheese Skillet Fondue

1 cup milk
2 tbs. butter of margarine
2 cups day old bread cubes
1 cup diced processed cheese food

2 eggs
1/2 tsp. salt
1/4 tsp. pepper
1/4 tsp. dry mustard
4 to 6 slices of seasoned tomatoes or buttered toast

Add milk to bread, let stand while fixing remaining ingredients. Melt butter in large skillet over low heat. Add cheese, stir till melted. Stir eggs, salt, pepper and mustard into milk and bread mixture. Add all to cheese in skillet. Cook gently stirring 3 or 4 mins. until the mixture is thickened and thoroughly heated. Serve fondue heaped on tomato slices or toast. Serves 4-6.

Grilled Cheese and Bacon Sandwich

2 thin slices processed cheese food
3 slices crisp bacon
2 slices rye bread, toasted, buttered

Arrange bacon slices on one slice of toast. Top with cheese slices. Place under broiler, 3 inches from heat source. Broil until cheese melts. Top with other slice of toast. Serve warm.
