SEATTLE — (U.P.) — Pfc. Linwood E. Smith still likes the Army even though he lost his corporal's rating for snitching five pieces of candy from a box in Gen. Matthew Ridgway's Tokyo headquarters.

Smith arrived here Tuesday en route to his home in Fredericksburg, Va., on rotation leave.

He told interviewers he plans to stay in the Army despite the Tokyo incident which cost him a job on the general's honor guard and \$17 a month—the difference in the pay received by corporals and privates first class.

"The Army teaches you if a man makes a mistake, he gets a chance to make up for it," he said. "That's what I'm after. The Army's my career and I'm staying with it."

Among the ceiling prices were: three pence per pound for the best beef and three shillings ten pence per pound for the best New England rum. A shilling then was worth about 23 modern cents, a penny about one penny.

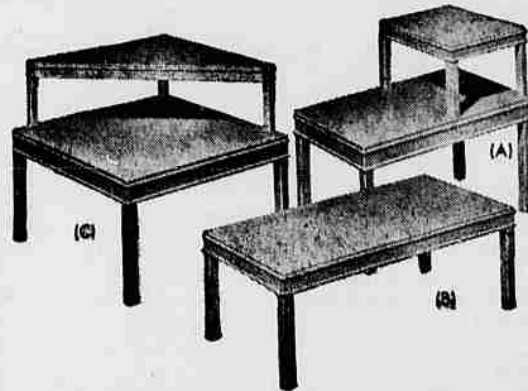

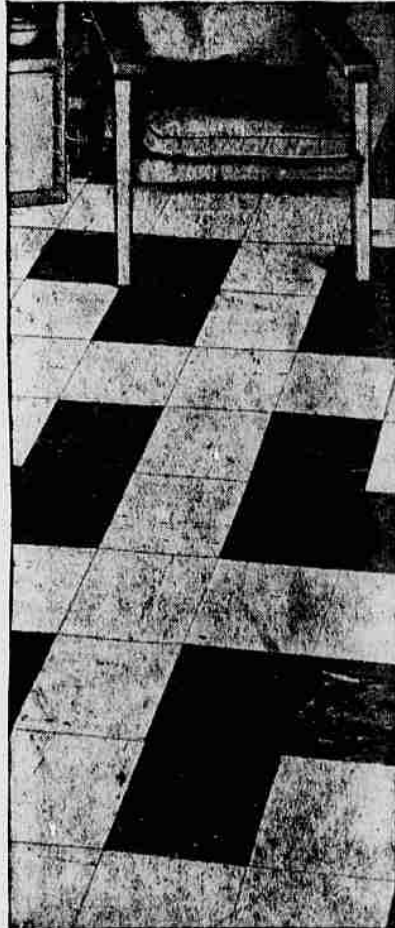

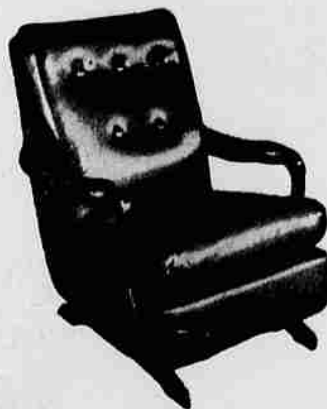
