Stress A-Bomb, Groves Urges

NEW YORK — (AP) — It is time the United States relied on the atomic bomb rather than on large ground armies, says Lt. Gen. Leslie R. Groves, wartime head of the atom bomb project.

The retired general adds: "You can't fight Russia on foot. The distances are too great. Their defense is too elastic."

Groves told a meeting of sales executives Tuesday that in the event of war the U. S. would have to destroy Russia's industrial potential. That, he said, "means bombing and using the strongest bomb available."

1—The watermark on the paper was not designed until 15 years after the claimed date of the document.

3—The type of paper fastener used was not manufactured until 10 years later.

Fire Destroys Hay Carrier

OAKRIDGE — A truck and semi-trailer loaded with hay was completely destroyed by fire on Highway 58 about six miles east of McCready Springs at 3 a.m. Tuesday.

The vehicle was one of a caravan of three trucks coming into the Willamette Valley from a ranch at Bonanza, Ore. The owner's and driver's identity were not known.

Garagemen at Oakridge said the fire was apparently caused by a short in the truck's wiring, and estimated loss at about \$10,000—some \$500 of that for the hay. The load had weighed about 12 tons. Only three tons were saved.

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Officials to Study Fate Of Yaquina Lighthouse

Newport's plea for saving the old Yaquina lighthouse will be given high-level study, Gov. Douglas McKay advised the Eugene Register-Guard Wednesday.

The old lighthouse, built in 1871, was about to be razed by the state highway department when townspeople organized in a fight to keep their landmark. The State Highway Commission last week granted a "stay of execution" of a year and Newport started to lay plans to move

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the structure to another site for possible use as a museum.

Governor McKay informed the Register-Guard that he will refer the matter to the commission, with a request that a report be made back to him after commission members have had an opportunity to make a study.

The Astorian-Budget has editorialized to save the old building. "Certainly the old lighthouse should be preserved as an attraction... if it is practical to do so," the newspaper said, commenting on a Register-Guard story of last week.

From a Eugene author came the comment, "What this town and the state needs is a vigilante committee to try to save what little we have left of our early history."

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
