Local Unions Mull 'Pathetic' Voting

A meeting to organize a committee of active political workers which would attempt to cure what was termed labor's "pathetic" voting record in Lane County drew some 50 labor leaders to the Labor Temple Tuesday night. Joe Willis, secretary of Roofers Local 156, AF of L, presided as temporary chairman of the meeting, called by the Central Labor Council. Following an open meeting, about 20 persons met to organize a political committee.

Emphasizing the need for political activity by representatives of organized labor, Willis said, "On politics rests the entire destiny of the working man. . . We must protect our gains by favorable political action. We must save the friends we have in Congress and put more friends of labor in."

THE QUESTION was raised but not settled in the open meeting of whether the local committee should affiliate with the nationwide Labor League for Political Education or operate as an independent body. Willis explained that the Labor League is designed to support the friends of labor on local, state and national fronts. Some persons at the meeting thought that if the committee were kept on a local level it would swing more weight with local voters.

Joseph Ayers, of Springfield, thought that an education committee which would "let us know both sides" would be desirable. He stated that with only one daily newspaper in this area the voter had to "read between the lines," getting a "negative view." The need and methods for registering eligible voters was discussed at length. Proposals were made to enroll workers during their lunch periods by setting up "a fixed place of business" as required by law when an organization is registering voters. Willis also deplored the "restrictive laws" which are hamstringing labor on all sides, stating that the "present big wages won't be worth a plug nickel" unless labor asserts itself.
