ANGELES—UP—A family  
 expert says her studies  
 marriage is becoming in-  
 creasingly popular.  
 that present-day young peo-  
 ple marry younger than their par-  
 ents, but  
 they don't select their spous-  
 es as early.  
 Evelyn M. Duvall of the  
 University of Chicago told an an-  
 nual meeting of obstetricians  
 that the girls of the post-  
 war generation "take advantage  
 of the things they can find  
 more easily."  
 said more than half of the  
 girls in the United States now  
 marry by the time they are 20,  
 but were fewer spinsters than  
 in the period from 1890 to  
 1910 when 50 per cent of girls  
 aged 20 and 24 were unmar-  
 ried.  
 said, less than 33 per cent of  
 girls in the 20-to-24 age group  
 were married, she said.  
 said, she said, 78.6 per cent  
 of the population was married.  
 said the population increased  
 50 per cent between 1900 and  
 1940, and the number of marriages  
 increased 123 per cent.  
 said in the same period, the di-  
 vorce rate increased 374 per cent.
