YOUTH SUFFERS MINOR BURNS IN \$15,000 FIRE

COTTAGE GROVE — A 150-foot long machine shop at the C. C. Purdy Ranch about 10 miles west of here was destroyed by fire Tuesday afternoon with a loss estimated at \$15,000.

Donnie Parks, 18, ranch helper, suffered minor burns on his wrist when he entered the burning structure to help save equipment.

Loss would have been much larger except that a large combine which is normally stored in the machine shed was out on loan when the fire started.

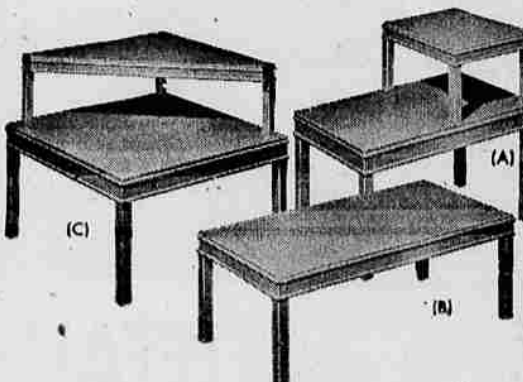

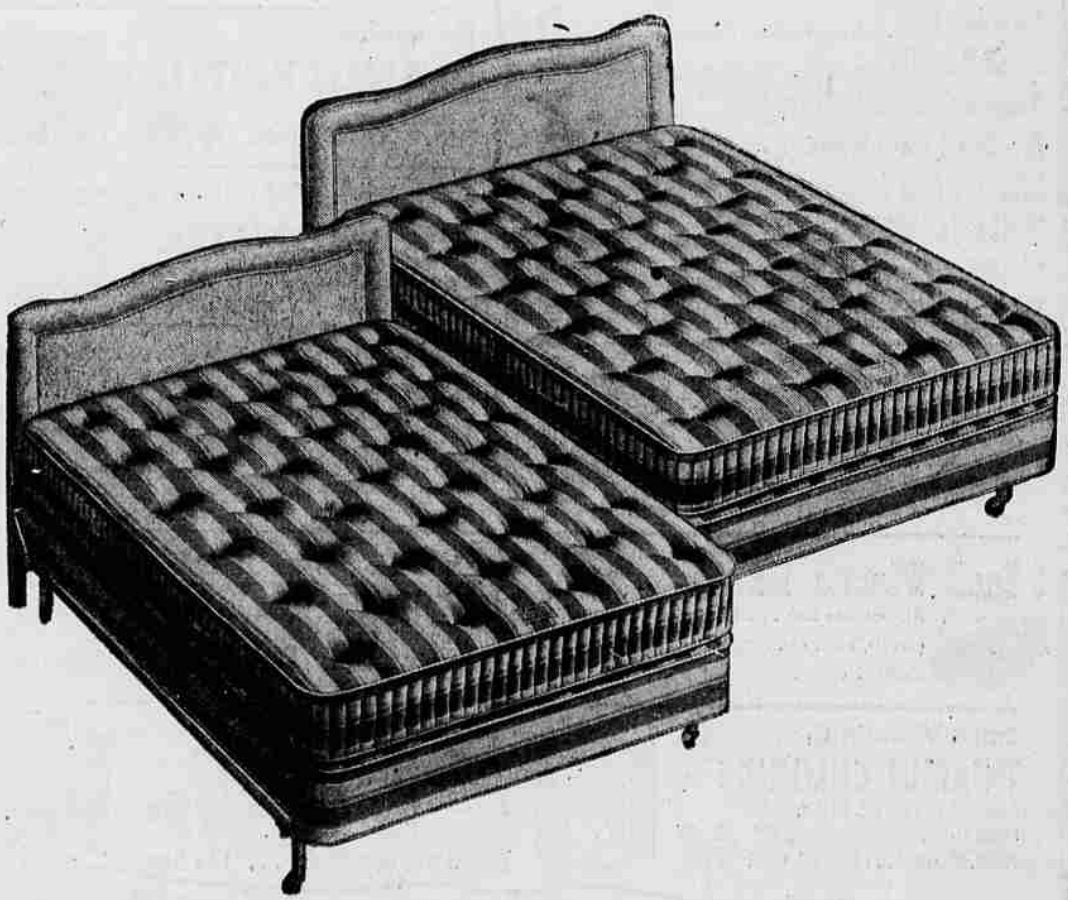

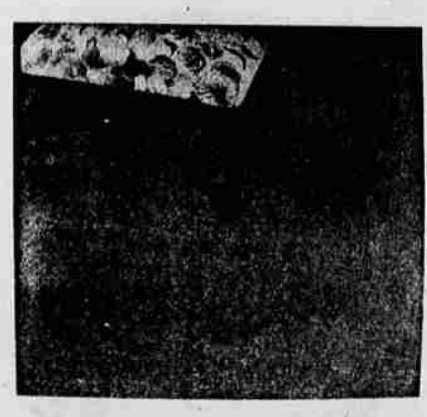
