

Morse Defends Chiefs of Staff

Senator Urges
Help for Europe

DALLAS, Tex. — (AP) — Sen. Wayne Morse (R-Ore.) said Sunday those who want all-out war in Asia are being unduly critical of the joint chiefs of staff.

Morse defended the joint chiefs in a speech before the United Jewish Appeal regional conference here. He said the joint chiefs were doing what they could to absorb the first shocks of all-out war, when and if they come.

MORSE'S COMMENTS could be interpreted as critical of Sen. Robert A. Taft (R-Ohio). Taft, a candidate for Republican nomination to the presidency, criticized the joint chiefs while he was in the Pacific Northwest last week. He said they had failed to meet commitments.

Morse told his audience that "unless we help Europe to defend itself and to raise its standards of living, its people will be an easy prey of Communism. We cannot walk out of Europe either militarily or economically and have allies," he said.

"THE EUROPEAN people are simply not going to buy the so-called perimeter defense theory of the new isolationism in America. According to this theory, all we need to do is surround our friends abroad with American Navy and air bases—and then, if Russia attacks them, we would liberate them by pulverizing their cities."

Morse said Gen. Eisenhower was his choice for President.

Memorial Services Held for King George

PORTLAND — (AP) — A memorial service for King George VI, under the auspices of the British Societies of Portland, was held at Trinity Episcopal Church Sunday night.

The Rev. R. A. Court Simmonds, rector emeritus of St. Mark's Episcopal Church, gave the memorial address.

The service was closed with a bagpipe lament.

Billy Graham Ends Crusade in Capital

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Evangelist Billy Graham said Sunday night—at the close of his five-week revival crusade—"There are still sinners left in Washington who need Jesus Christ."

The 33-year-old preacher told an estimated 14,000 persons packed in the National Guard Armory "on this last day, my last word to you is to prepare to meet thy God. For weeks I've stood here and preached the Gospel straight."

"For five weeks you've had your chance to come to Christ."

"Ladies and gentlemen, I beg of you to open your hearts right now, and let Jesus come in and take over your life else it may be too late."

Graham described the predicament in after-life of those who refused to be saved: "The Angel Gabriel will pull down the screen, and start up the projector, and every moment in the new soul's life will flash past."

"You'll see this very meeting. You'll hear the music. You'll hear the sermon."

"Then you'll cry, 'Why, why, why, O God, why didn't I rush forward to receive my Savior when I had the chance?'"

At one point in the service, originally scheduled to be held on the grounds of the Washington Monument, but moved indoors because of bad weather, Graham called on the Rev. Clarence W. Cranford, minister of the Calvary Baptist Church of Washington, for a prayer.

He asked that the prayer be said for the nation, for a new religious revival, and for those behind the Iron Curtain, including "Joseph Stalin, Russian dictator," as much as anyone else, "so there would be peace in our time."

Associates of Graham said that a total of 307,500 persons had attended the "Billy Graham Greater Washington Evangelistic Crusade," and 6115 had signed conversion pledge cards. A total of 462 persons stepped forward at Sunday's call for converts, they added.

The first American Red Cross war fund campaign, conducted in 1917, raised \$115,000,000 in one week.

Mrs. Phyllis Christensen, of the bride and groom's wedding party, was killed. Wadsworth, 38, all of Ogden and Mrs. Clarence Sharp of Clearfield, Utah.

The young couple had been married Saturday. Trooper Faclin Wood of Utah State Highway Patrol said the Green car failed to make a curve on U. S. Highway entrance to Kayaville and into the trailer.
