Cab Driver Accuses Senator Mahoney

PORTLAND — (AP) — State Sen. Thomas R. Mahoney, Portland attorney, was arrested here Thursday on a complaint charging assault and battery and was released on \$50 bail.

The warrant on the charge, brought by Wayne Hull, an Oregon City taxi driver, was served on Mahoney in the city room of the Oregonian here.

HULL COMPLAINED that Mahoney knocked some money out of his hand and pushed him, after a cab driver had answered a call to the Oregon City Elks Club Wednesday night.

Mahoney denied the charge. He said he stopped in Oregon City en route from Salem to meet a friend. He said he was leaving the club when he was accosted by a man who he assumed was Hull.

He claimed the senator and a companion had ordered a cab. Mahoney said they had not.

"THE TAXI driver grabbed me," he said, "and insisted he was entitled to a fee." Mahoney said he only exerted sufficient force to get him to release me.

Mahoney, advised the warrant had been issued, agreed to meet the taxi driver and Portland police. The Oregonian said it could be proved. He got permission to post bail by phoning District Judge Paul C. Fischer at Oregon City.

There's Gold in Woodlots Experts Tell Farm Owners

Can you afford to grow a crop of trees on your land? Can you make more money in trees than in grass pasture or other crops? The answer may be a resounding YES to both questions, if your land is best suited to forest growth.

Oregon and Washington are full of case histories of hopeful settlers who went against nature and tried to convert forest land into crop land. Reason for failure in most cases, so expert soil men tell us, is that forest lands generally lack some vital mineral and food elements which farm crops require. Trees will grow well on this land which is best suited for a forest crop.

HOW MUCH can I make off my forest land? Take the typical case of the Snohomish County farmer in Washington who has made his 80 acres of woodland pay well. In 1940 he began managing his second-growth timber. Since that time he has taken off a total of approximately \$1,500 in cash from timber sales, plus 180 cords of fuel for home use, materials for a new barn, including a cedar shake roof, and enough fence posts for a mile of fence.

This amounted to \$6.60 an acre from his woodland each year; \$2.77 in cash plus an estimated \$3.83 in fence posts, fuelwood and building materials. He estimated that it has cost him about 42 cents per acre per year for taxes, fire protection, interest on his investment and general costs. He still has his forest in excellent condition.

HOW CAN you manage a second-growth forest for permanent income? You can sell some products right along as the forest is growing. Thinnings may yield pulpwood, cedar poles, alder and maple bolts, Douglas fir poles and piling and fuelwood.

The Snohomish farmer discovered that his woodlands had increased in value about 500 per cent from 1940 to 1949 because of the increased volume due to faster growth after thinning, proper care of his forest and increased value of his growing timber. A bonus for good husbandry.

DO YOU have to wait 50 to 100 years to get a harvest? No. You can sell some products right along while the young trees are growing into saw logs. The secret of getting the most out of your farm woodlot is to make numerous small harvests at the right time and in the right way.

You will then keep healthy growing trees on your land which are making money for you each year of growth. Next week we'll look at a typical young forest with critical eye.

Army Slates Release Of Anti-Aircraft Units

WASHINGTON — (AP) — The Army said Thursday it will begin releasing anti-aircraft units of the National Guard in June. All such units will be back under state control by May, 1953.

As each anti-aircraft artillery brigade, group or operations detachment of the National Guard is released, a new unit will be activated by the Army to take its place.

All these groups are sub-units of divisions. The ruling applies to units both in this country and overseas.

Trouble Again For Actor's Son

Robinson Jailed In Beverly Hills

BEVERLY HILLS, Calif. — (AP) — Trouble continues to pile up on Edward G. Robinson Jr., 19-year-old son of the movie actor.

He was jailed Thursday night on a felony warrant issued in Fullerton, Calif., charging that he issued a \$129 bank check with intent to defraud.

However, the actor bailed his son out of jail early Friday. Robinson Sr. sent an attorney to the jail with the actor's \$1000 check.

On this guarantee of 10 per cent of the \$10,000 bond, a bonding company posted the bail and Robinson Jr. was released.

THE YOUTH was ordered out of his father's home after eloping early this month to Tijuana, Mexico, and marrying Frances Chisholm, 24-year-old actress. His father also discontinued his \$70 weekly allowance.

U. J. Ledger, Fullerton garage employee who signed the complaint, said young Robinson bought two premium tires and tubes worth \$139 after having a blowout one night.

HE SAID that when Robinson's check was returned he wrote the youth, only to have his letter ignored.

Young Robinson's wife told police that he promised to make good the check.

4 Ex-Soldiers Held by FBI

SEATTLE — (AP) — Four former soldiers were held Thursday on charges of illegally wearing Army uniforms after they were arrested at Fort Lawton by Federal Bureau of Investigation agents.

The men were arrested following complaints that Fort Lawton soldiers were being bilked in dice games. John F. Dore, assistant U. S. attorney, said agents confiscated loaded dice in possession of the men.

R. D. Auerbach, agent in charge of the Seattle FBI office, said the ex-soldiers gained entrance to the fort by wearing Army uniforms.

Arrested were Robert T. Irving, 30; Jake Hughes, 28; Edward Sims, Jr., 28, and Charles Jordan, 35, all of Seattle.

Oregon Forest Survey Urged To Replace Old Records

WASHINGTON — (AP) — A re-survey of forests in Oregon and other timber states to show modern conditions was urged Thursday by Rep. Stockman, Oregon Republican.

Stockman said in a statement to the House Appropriations Subcommittee now considering appropriation requests for the Federal Forest Service for the year starting July 1, that available surveys are "badly out of date."

HE ASKED approval of \$898 thousand for forest surveys, declaring that tremendous changes have occurred in timber uses and in forest industries in the 20 years since the first survey was made.

"We must know the facts regarding our timber resources to determine the kind of management policies needed to sustain our industries on a permanent basis," he said.

STOCKMAN also urged approval of a 13 million dollar request for forest development roads and trails, but expressed regret that no increase had been asked in funds for access road construction. He said that over-ripe timber on thousands of acres is going to waste each year because it is inaccessible.

"A few million dollars for the construction of roads into such areas would pay off handsomely in facilitating the harvest of timber at the peak of its volume and quality, in hastening the regrowth of new timber on the area, and in increasing returns to the Treasury," he said.

HE FAVORED a \$1,083,379 request for timber sale administration on grounds it will return added revenues to the Treasury through increased sales; urged acceptance of a \$370 thousand request for fire control, contending it would result in reduced losses of natural resources in reduced emergency fire fighting obligations; and endorsed a \$31,397 request to carry out research into the control of the halogeton weed.

'Smart' Robber Blames Drug For Lengthy Crime Record

PORTLAND — (AP) — Marvin Jack Ryan, 20, appraised himself as something of an intellectual with a great talent, a habit of drug addiction and a regret for crime.

He did that Thursday in an interview at the city jail where police had appraised him as a piano-playing robber with a lengthy record.

Ryan gave himself up in Los Angeles on a Portland robbery charge.

IN THE COURSE of the robbery, at the Dr. James O. Nibley home, he had taken time out to play a classical piano selection and Mrs. Nibley said it was a "faultless" piece of work.

Once before, in 1950, he had been wanted for an Oregon City robbery.

He gave himself up that time, too, and drew a three-year-sentence.

In the city jail, where he arrived Wednesday night he said he got into trouble because he used heroin.

"I'm guilty as hell, but the penitentiary won't cure me," he said. "If I wasn't on dope I wouldn't commit crimes."

RYAN said he taught himself to play the piano by picking out tunes on a church piano.

He said playing well came easily and naturally and at one time a woman was going to arrange for him to take lessons as a preliminary to a concert career.
