Protestants to Seek Six Millions in Relief Appeal

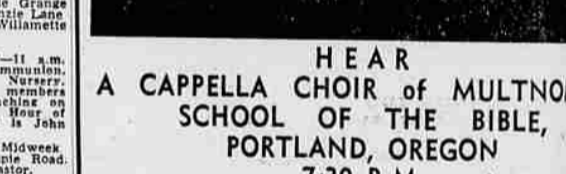

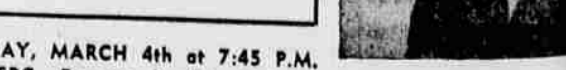
