

Bethel Chapel To Build Soon On Wood Ave.

Two lots have been purchased at the corner of Wood and Lassen avenues in the Bethel area, where the first Christian Church is sponsoring another chapel in its suburban expansion program, Bethel Christian. This is the third branch church to be established within the city. Other churches sponsored by the College Crest and Allison centers, where strong organizations are being built.

The new property is on high ground in a central location. The building site will be on Lassen street, where it makes a graceful curve into Wood, there being no street intersection, and it will face down Wood Avenue with an unobstructed view from Bethel Drive. Plans are being made for the erection of a suitable chapel and Sunday school rooms where a full-fledged church program can be conducted. The work will be non-denominational in nature and all residents, irrespective of former church connections are invited.

The forming of this work is the result of a community survey conducted by First Christian about the first of the year when 56 homes out of a possible 330 were contacted and 133 families expressed a desire for a Sunday school and preaching service to be established.

Sunday school and church services are being held temporarily at the home of Mr. and Mrs. M. C. Maugh, 2537 Wood Avenue. Mr. and Mrs. Dan Thuma, students at Northwest Christian College, are ministering to this new church. Mr. and Mrs. Otto Crumley, directors of suburban expansion for First Christian, are supervising the Sunday school.

Inar Ekberg Sings in Eugene

Inar Ekberg, baritone vocalist, will appear in sacred concert in Eugene at the Assembly of God, Sunday, March 4, at 7:45 p.m.

Ekberg, a native of Sweden, through extensive studies reached a place of great popularity in his land. His records are heard in the palace of the King, and in the home of the lowly alike. Over 25 years Ekberg was a soloist in the largest church in Stockholm with a membership approaching 7000.

During World War II, he presented numerous concerts in the Scandinavian countries and in Finland, through which he raised over \$200,000 for the Red Cross.

Ekberg has now made his home in Pasadena, Calif., and has recently traveled in concert tours throughout the United States, Canada, and Mexico.

In this city he will present some of the favorite songs and make a special presentation to the American people through the instrument of their forefathers. Admission will be charged, but offering will be received.

GO TO CHURCH DURING THE More New Churches For Spring, 1952

Church expansion in Eugene this spring is really noteworthy.

Bethel Christian, a chapel of First Christian, announces purchase of a lot and plans to build, at the West end of Wood Avenue. Allison Park Christian, another chapel of the downtown church, also announces plan to build its main sanctuary, or auditorium, on the front of the present structure. It seems only yesterday that Allison Park Chapel was opened. Actually it was Oct. 14, 1951.

This week the Presbyterians also announce the formation of a new Sunday school, on Harlow Road, which no doubt will soon become a chapel and then a church. Latter Day Saints last week hinted at another, larger church in Eugene; Assembly of God committee members are walking around the back part of their property, measuring things, with building in mind; the Lutherans laid a cornerstone last Sunday for Our Redeemer Church's building; Church of the Nazarene soon finishes a building.

The 40 voice A Cappella Choir of Multnomah School of the Bible, Portland, Ore., directed by Lauren B. Sykes, will present a concert of sacred music in First Baptist Church Sunday, March 2, at 7:30 p.m. The program will include selections by Bach, Grieg, Tschai-kowski and other well-known composers. The public is cordially invited. There will be no admission charge.

Dr. Willard M. Aldrich, president of the school, will speak.

The Sunday school at the Church of the Nazarene has set itself a goal of 600 attending at Easter. This is to be achieved by a six weeks' "attendance climb." Attendance now is running around 300. Each class is assigned a definite gain to meet per Sunday, with an additional three persons for Easter Sunday. The new auditorium will be used for Sunday school Easter Sunday, with two simultaneous services, in the new building, and both featuring the Sunday school, at the 9:45 a.m. hour. The 11 a.m. Easter service will be in the old building. They hope to have the new building completed within three months, by June or July.

The whole offering from all church school classes and departments at First Christian Church will be devoted to the "Week of Compassion" offering this next Sunday. Nothing is to be held back for local purposes. Last year the church gave \$894.87.

To welcome their new pastor, the Rev. George McDonough of San Francisco, the Unitarian members have worked hard on redecorating the interior of their manse. The living-dining room was given a pale green and white motif. The kitchen and bathroom are in off-whites, and the upstairs rooms have been lined with plywood. Wiring and heating facilities have been greatly improved.

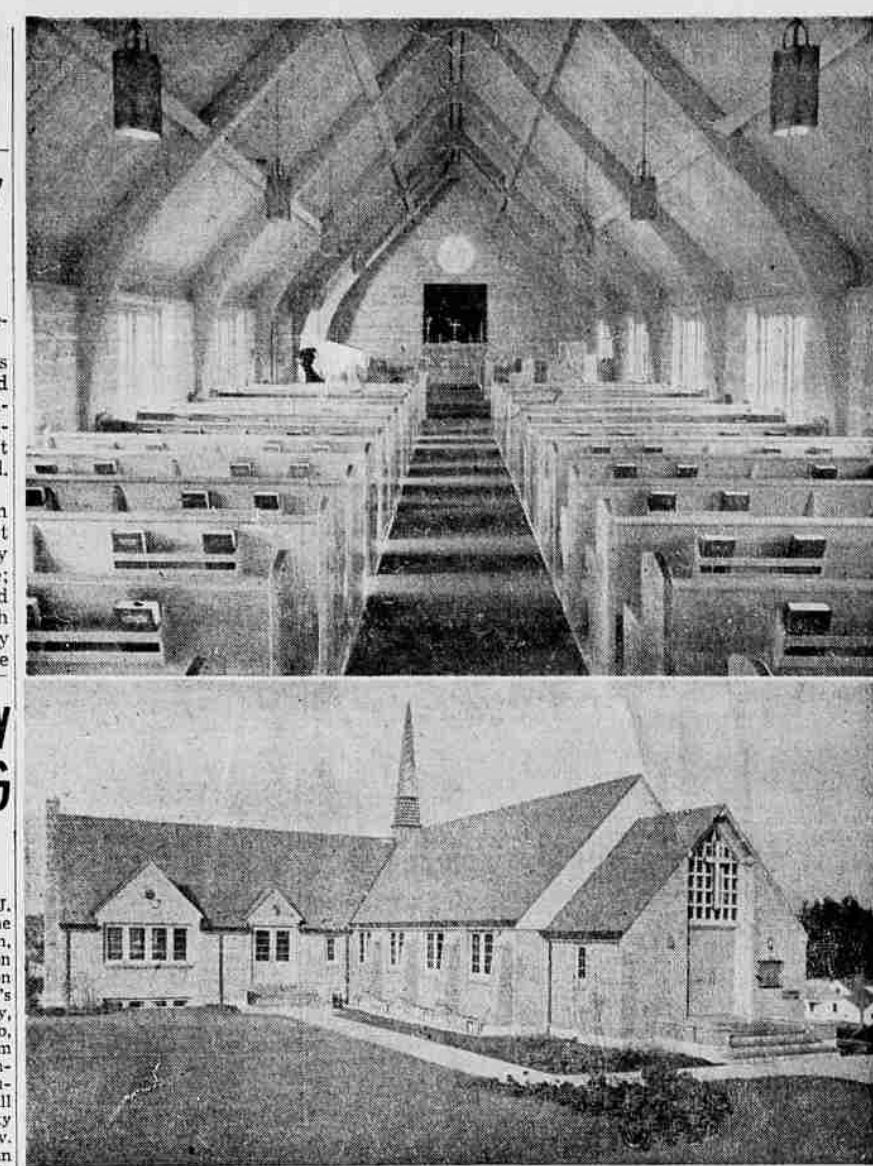

THIS WEEK'S Register-Guard trip to a church discovers, United Lutheran at 22nd and Washington. The pink brick exterior with its dark-toned asbestos roof is well known to persons who have occasion to drive through the College Crest area. Note the progress of the landscaping since the church was finished last spring. Inside, the very tall, peaked roof gives a feeling of space and quietness to the shadowy sanctuary. The light is dim but sunny, through amber-toned cathedral glass windows. Clear gray pumice-stone walls, left natural, harmonize with the light-tinted Philippine mahogany pews, altar, and tall rafters.
