

'Streetcar' Tops Nationwide Poll

Brando, Vivien Leigh
Named Top Performers

HOLLYWOOD—(AP)—"A Streetcar Named Desire" and three of its players are winners in an Associated Press nationwide poll of movie critics.

Previewers on member newspapers and radio stations picked the Tennessee Williams tragedy as the best film of 1951.

They voted its stars, Marlon Brando and Vivien Leigh, top honors among starring actors and actresses.

Karl Malden, who played Miss Leigh's suitor in the powerful drama, won among supporting actors.

LEE GRANT, the scared shoplifter hauled into a New York police station in "Detective Story," was first in the supporting-actress field.

"Streetcar" collected 69 votes, followed by "A Place in the Sun," 61, and "Detective Story," 21½. A few reviewers divided their preferences between two pictures. "An American in Paris" had 17, "Quo Vadis" 9.

Brando's winning total was 67½ votes. Next came Arthur Kennedy "Bright Victory" 38; Kirk Douglas "Detective Story" 26½; Fredric March "Death of a Salesman" 22; Montgomery Clift "A Place in the Sun" 20.

MISS LEIGH, with 99½ votes, had the biggest total in any category. Following were Jane Wyman "The Blue Veil" 47; Shelly Winners "A Place in the Sun" 46; Judy Holliday "Born Yesterday" 10½, and Eleanor Park "Detective Story" 9.

The poll representing a cross section of critical opinion, brought ballots from 241 reviewers on AP member newspapers and radio stations in 44 states and Alaska.

U.S. Tax Levies Cause Rebellion

WASHINGTON —(AP)—There is something mighty like a tax rebellion stirring in this country. Public unhappiness under the added burden of federal income tax levies imposed in 1950 and 1951 is beginning to make an impression in Congress.

But the federal government is relatively remote from the people who support it. On a matter like taxes, the great federal bureaucracy is slow to get the word. State governments are simpler and a lot closer to the voters.

STATE governments are getting the word with considerable emphasis. A United Press check over the weekend showed that at least 13 states recently have eased income or other tax levies or have plans to do so. Maryland and Virginia, the states between which lies the national capital, lead the parade.

Maryland has just clipped state income taxes by 15 per cent. Virginia has a treat-the-taxpayers-right law which provided a 20 per

cent income tax cut on 1950 income and may reduce it some more this year and, even, thereafter.

The other states which have eased taxes or whose officials plan to do so are: Alabama, Arkansas, Georgia, Kansas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Missouri, South Carolina, South Dakota, Utah and Wisconsin. Not all the reductions were on income. But they all kept dollars in the taxpayers' pocket which otherwise would have been spent by government.

The Virginia law which has accomplished so much is an automatic proposition. A simple, minus detail explanation of the Virginia act is that when revenue exceeds budgeted expectations taxes are reduced.

The state government receives and may spend the sum it proposed to raise by taxation. But if the weary taxpayers actually pay more than that into the state treasury, the state government must give it back to the taxpayers.

FEDERAL officials frequently are way off in their tax estimates. As often as not their mistake is to underestimate by hundreds of millions what tax proceeds will be. When that happens in the federal government, the officials have just that much more money to spend—and they spend it.

Even when tax proceeds exceed Treasury estimates there usually is a deficit and still more money must be borrowed to pay the government bills. Virginia, of course, has a balanced budget.

The name of the state legislator who sponsored the Virginia tax act is Byrd—Harry F. Byrd, Jr. He comes naturally by his interest in the taxpayer. His father is Sen. Harry F. Byrd, (D-Va) who has been trying for years to get a break for the payers of federal income tax.

WASHINGTON —(AP)—An ex-convict described as extremely dangerous and long-sought for the killing of a woman in Michigan was added to the FBI's list of "10 most wanted men" Monday. He is Isale Aldy Beausoleil, 49, native of Canada, and known by the nickname "Frenchy".

Truman to Appeal For Aid Program

WASHINGTON —(AP)—President Truman will carry to the country his fight for \$7.9 billion foreign aid program with a nationwide radio and television address Thursday night.

He is expected to appeal for public support in what may be a fight with a critical Congress.

AT ABOUT THE same time, Congress is expected to receive the President's program for new overseas military and economic aid, calling for about \$7.9 billion in fresh appropriations.

The President will speak over all major radio and television networks between 7:30 and 8 p.m., PST, Thursday, the White House announced.

He is expected to underline

Secretary of State Acheson's contention that the Foreign aid program "deserves our utmost support."

Acheson made the statement Friday night after concluding a broadcast summary of steps taken in recent weeks to hasten unified defenses for western Europe.

THE SECRETARY'S report brought some Congressional predictions that the President faced a battle to get approval for his full program.

Sen. Joseph O'Mahoney (D-Wyo.) said "I believe reductions can be made in the foreign military program." The Senator, who has proposed a \$10 billion slash in government spending, said he favored cutting foreign military funds ahead of economic assistance.

Rep. Mansfield (D-Mont.), a member of the House Foreign Affairs Committee and delegate to the Paris U.N. conference, said the administration would be "doing well" to get approval for 7 billion dollars in foreign aid.

Last year Congress cut \$1.2 billion from the President's request for \$8.5 billion in foreign assistance.
