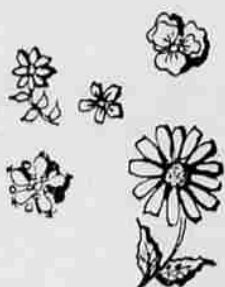

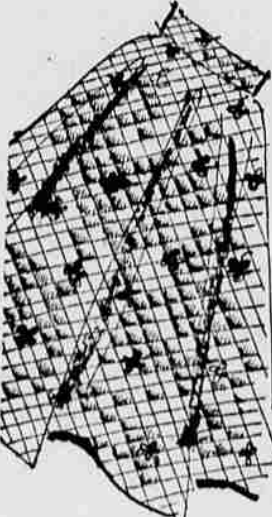

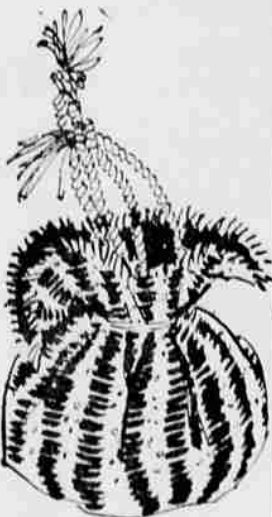

MIG Downed In Brief Fight

Fighter-Bombers Hit Communist Rails

SEOUL, Korea — (AP) — American Sabre jets destroyed a Communist MIG and damaged another Thursday in a 10-minute battle. The dogfight ranged as far south as the North Korean capital, Pyongyang, just 70 miles north of Parallel 38.

Capt. Henry Frazier of Stuart, Fla., was credited with shooting down the Red jet in a fight between six Sabres and 22 MIGs. Col. Harrison Tynan, commander of the Fourth Wing, reported one MIG damaged.

ALLIED fighter-bombers cut Communist rail lines in 92 places and destroyed or damaged 50 box-cars, the Fifth Air Force said. Marine Corsair pilots reported destroying two Communist tanks in attacks northeast of Pyongyang, apex city of the old Communist iron triangle.

On the ground, hit-and-run Allied raiders killed 40 Communists and wounded 30 in four firefights west of the Mundung Valley in Eastern Korea.

U. N. artillery and infantrymen pinched off a Chinese Communist attack near the old iron triangle on the Central Front Thursday morning.

About 160 Reds opened fire on an advanced U. N. position near the Kunhwa-Kumson road about midnight. The Reds were hurled back after a one hour and 15 minute fight.

ALLIED PILOTS found good weather over northwestern Korea Thursday morning, and went out in force bombing Red railroads and highways, supply dumps and troop positions.

Marine fighters from the U. S. Carrier Bairoko attacked Red trains, supply centers and troops positions on Korea's west coast Wednesday.

Across the peninsula the U. S. Cruisers St. Paul and Manchester and the Destroyer Henderson bombarded Communist troops on the eastern end of the battle line near Kansong.

Teachers Get Raise

ASHLAND — Ashland school teachers will get a cost-of-living salary boost of \$118 plus higher increments, school board members reported Thursday.

Action to grant the pay boosts on next year's contracts was taken by the board at its regular monthly meeting Tuesday.

Crowd Protests Negro Family's Home Purchase

SAN PABLO, Calif. — (AP) — A Negro Contractor Wilbur Gary's family was established Thursday in their new home in a previously all-white district, undismayed by taunting, stone-throwing neighbors.

The 42-year old war veteran, his wife and seven children ignored a hostile crowd of 150 that gathered around his \$8,700 home, jeered and threw stones Wednesday night.

Some 50 persons friendly to Gary also assembled on his lawn. They faced the crowd protesting his moving into Rollingwood Tract, just south of San Pablo and 15 miles across the bay from San Francisco.

Leading the friendly group was the Rev. Fred H. Busher, pastor of a Richmond Methodist church. He planted an American flag on the road in front of Gary's home and began reciting the Declaration of Independence.

He was immediately interrupted by jeers, catcalls and boos.

The fuss outside his home did not appear to upset Gary, a vice commander in an Oakland American Legion post.

"We don't scare easily. I'm going to stay," he said. Earlier he had rejected an offer from the Rollingwood Improvement Association to buy him out for a \$1,200 profit.

Storm Brews Over McCarthy

Committee to Ask Decision on Probe

WASHINGTON — (AP) — An election year storm appeared to be brewing Thursday over whether to continue an inquiry into a demand that Sen. McCarthy (R-Wis) be ousted from Congress. Sen. Welker (R-Idaho) called a move for a Senate vote on the question "pure politics." He said the administration is trying to prevent re-election of McCarthy this fall, McCarthy agreed.

However, Sen. Gillette (D-Ia) declared "There is nothing more certain than the fact there is no political motive of any kind behind this move."

Gillette is chairman and Welker a member of a Senate rules subcommittee which voted 4-1 Wednesday to try for a Senate decision on whether the group should go ahead with its month-old investigation of ouster charges made against McCarthy by Sen. Benton (D-Conn).

McCarthy has challenged the subcommittee's authority to conduct the inquiry.

Gillette said the Wisconsin Republican had "impugned the integrity" of the members by charging the group was spending "tens of thousands of dollars of the taxpayers" to provide the Democrats with political ammunition against McCarthy.

The subcommittee voted to ask the Senate to decide whether there is any basis for McCarthy's charges—in effect a request for a vote of confidence and a decision whether the inquiry should be continued.

Stone Placed For Building

FOREST GROVE — (AP) — Construction of a new science and optometry building at Pacific University got underway here Tuesday with cornerstone laying ceremonies.

Among those taking part in the ceremony were Dr. Clarence G. Caraker, Portland, chairman of the Western Advisory Board of Colleges of Optometry; Dr. Raymond R. Roy, president of the Oregon Optometric Assn., and Dr. Walter Giersbach, president of the university.

The building will be named after the late G. Orlo Jefferson, who donated money for the building which is to be completed by May 1.

Ashland to Screen Newsstand Wares

ASHLAND — (AP) — The Ashland City Council will name a five-member board Friday to cull "objectionable" articles from publications sold on newsstands here.

The council voted to set up the review board at the suggestion of the Rev. W. H. Hillman of the First Baptist Church who met with 35 citizens Tuesday. The citizen group recommended the council take action to screen published articles available to the public.

Police will be empowered to act on the recommendations of the board of review.
