Holy Week's Rites Lead Up to Climax

The last week of Jesus' life was packed with exciting happenings each of which has profound significance in Christian life. This week, leading up to the church's greatest festival, is a very important and busy one for Eugene churches.

The historic events: the triumphal entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday; the Last Supper on Maundy Thursday; the trial and crucifixion on Good Friday; the seven last utterances spoken on the cross; and finally the resurrection itself, Easter Sunday.

All are recognized in Eugene by ceremonies and worship services. St. Mary's Catholic Church has its annual "Seven Last Words," by Du Bois, concert. Sacred concerts are offered also by the Congregational and Central Lutheran Churches, and several others.

Jewish Group Begins Work On New Synagogue

Work has begun on the long-planned for new synagogue for Eugene's Jewish families. Beth Israel Synagogue, located for many years on West Eighth Avenue between Charnelton and Lincoln Streets, in an old white frame house of pioneer architecture, will move into an ultra-modern brick and concrete structure off South Willamette Street at Portland Street, probably in the first part of September.

A picture and full description of the new building plans will be published in an early issue.

Work on the foundation started about two weeks ago, according to Harry Rubenstein, president of the congregation and chairman of the building committee.

The local group of about 30 families has no Rabbi as yet, and does not hold weekly services.

Missouri Synod Churches Report 'Over the Top'

The Rev. E. D. Busch, pastor of Hope Lutheran Church in Springfield, and area representative of the Lutheran Church (Missouri Synod), reports that the three Missouri Synod churches in this area went "over the top" of their \$6000 goal by better than \$2400, on March 23.

They joined 5000 other congregations throughout the United States and Canada to raise \$10,000,000 for mission and education expansion throughout the world.

Grace Lutheran Church, 11th & Ferry Sts., Eugene, Hope Lutheran Church, 14th & B Sts., Springfield and Trinity Lutheran Church, 7th & Quincy, Cottage Grove are the three congregations raising a total of \$8405. Of this total to date, Grace Lutheran Church, Eugene contributed \$4820, Hope Lutheran Church, Springfield contributed \$2000 and Trinity Lutheran Church, Cottage Grove contributed \$1585.

The money was raised entirely within the membership of the respective congregations.

Commenting on the reason for this fund-raising effort in these days of higher taxes and spiraling costs of living, Pastor Busch said: "Bringing Christ to the Nations is their way of making a lasting contribution for a better world today and tomorrow."

It is estimated that the three congregations will exceed the \$9000 figure when the reports are complete. The total offering for the entire church body throughout the United States and Canada has not been officially announced to date.

The Youth Fellowship of the Church of God in Eugene will give a tea honoring the young people of the congregation soon to graduate from local high schools, Sunday, April 6. The tea will be held in the Youth Fellowship Room of the church, 2:30 to 4 p.m.

The Rev. Harold Summers, alumni director of Pacific Bible College, will be guest of honor. He will discuss with the group the advantages a Christian young person has in attending a church-affiliated college.

Arrangements for the tea will be under the direction of the executive committee of the youth council. Members serving on this committee are Martha Walker, Mariellen Westlake, and Lucille Westlake.

Church of God Gives Schedule For Holy Week

Special services are planned for Holy Week April 7-11 at the Church of God, Third and Monroe Streets. Preaching service will be held each evening with the exception of Wednesday and Saturday, from 7:30 to 8:30 p.m.

The Rev. Wilma I. Perry will interpret the Scriptures in sermons: Monday: "Why Did God Permit His Son to Suffer?" Tuesday: "Behold, How Jesus Suffered!" Wednesday: "Golgotha." The congregation will attend in a group the film "Golgotha" sponsored by the Eugene-Springfield Ministerial Association and being shown at the EUB church, Thursday: "That Night Before His Death."

Good Friday: "Why Did Jesus Suffer Without the Gate?" Thursday evening the congregations from Oakridge and Springfield will join the Eugene church in observing the Lord's Supper. The Rev. Lucille Johnson will speak.

Current 'Look' Carries Article Interpreting Easter

The true meaning of Easter is sacrifice, symbolized by the sacrifice of bodily existence in death to enable the spirit to be born again, Fulton Oursler said in an interpretation of Easter published in the issue of Look Magazine just released.

In celebrating Easter, he said, "it is easy to miss the point of crucifixion, which is a call to mankind to crucify his faults of hatred, envy, resentment and destructive selfishness in order to prepare for a spiritual resurrection."

Dursler compares the sacrifice of sin and the rebirth of the spirit to a seed which must sacrifice its individual existence to be reborn as a plant.

"Every seed carries within itself the promise of a larger growth," Oursler writes. "As long as the seed remains a prisoner of its shell, the promise is suspended. The seed must die, it must be buried and in the ground must sacrifice everything that makes it what it is, if it is to be born again."

"A man must sacrifice and die within himself, shedding the shell of hate and fear and selfishness. Then he can rise to new life, as the seed finds its soul in a flower. That is when Easter comes to a man's heart."
