Historian Notes Power of Ideas

Ideas will be as necessary to
victory in present world conflict
as military might, said Dr. George
H. Knoles, professor of history at
Stanford University, who spoke
on the University of Oregon
campus last week.

Knoles has spent the last two
summers in Japan working with
Stanford's educational project
there.

The United States, said Dr.
Knoles, has a great opportunity
in Japan now if "she doesn't turn
her back." This country can no
longer live behind its ocean fron-
tiers, he continued.

The need for continued eco-
nomic and political support for
Japan from this nation was stressed
by the historian. But, he said,
this country must also give Japan
an understanding of the cultural
and intellectual aspects of the
United States.
