Florists Send Posies by Air

Eugene's florists are still taking orders for delivery of flowers in faraway cities despite the Western Union Telegraph strike.

As a matter of fact, if customers get their Easter orders in early this week they'll probably save money over the usual flowers-by-wire rates, one florist reported Monday.

That's because orders received during the early part of the week will be relayed to other cities via airmail special delivery. Orders received too late for Easter for airmail and urgent orders are being relayed by long-distance telephone, usually at night rates.

In many cases, the florist said, the cost by telephone isn't any higher than by telegram.

Actor-Writer CS Lecturer

Oscar Graham Peeke, C.S.B. of Kansas City, Missouri, who will deliver a lecture on Christian Science in the Heilig Theater Tuesday, April 8, at 12 noon, received his education at a well-known English school.

He chose the theatrical profession for a career, came to this country to pursue it, and became a citizen of the United States. He played with a well-known Shakespearean star for three years, after which he wrote and produced his own plays.

While thus engaged he was healed for an illness at a time when he was reading "Science and Health With Key to the Scriptures," by Mary Baker Eddy. Thereafter the study of Christian Science absorbed his attention.

In 1914 he gave up all other professional work to devote his entire time to Christian Science.

During World War I, he served as a Christian Science welfare worker, and from 1928 to 1931 he served as committee on publication for Missouri. In 1928 he became an authorized teacher of Christian Science.

The lecture which Peeke will deliver is entitled, "Christian Science: The Divine Law of Healing" and is given under the auspices of First Church of Christ, Scientist, Eugene. The lecture is free and open to the public.

Burglar Takes Empty Boxes

Three empty cigar boxes were the loot of an agile burglar at the Pennywise Drug Store, 769 W. 6th Ave., sometime Saturday night.

Entry to the store was made through a high window in the building's front after the burglar failed to gain entrance to the Irish and Swartz Market next door. Police reports Monday said that two skylights on the market's roof had been broken, but apparently the 25-foot drop to the floor discouraged the burglar in one case and that venetian blinds, which looked like bars, discouraged him from going through the other skylight.

He climbed onto a canopy over the drug store's front door, broke out a plywood panel covering a window, and clambered down the magazine racks to the floor. Three boxes of cigars were dumped on the floor and the boxes taken, apparently to carry small articles and candy. Some candy and some small penlights may be missing, store employees said, according to the police reports. No money was in the cash register.

Princeton Man To Be Speaker

Ira O. Wade, chairman of the department of modern languages at Princeton University, will be the main speaker for the third annual Northwest Pacific Conference of foreign language teachers, to be held at the University April 17 through 19.

The principal address of the conference will be given by Professor Wade at the Saturday noon luncheon. His topic will be "Phonemes, Humanists, and Sabre jets," an exposition of the new programs of study in European culture which combine economics, history, geography, etc., with the study of literature and language.

Teachers of foreign languages from the high schools and colleges throughout the Northwest will meet at the University to attend the conference which is divided into three general sessions and six group sessions.
