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PRUETT'S SKY REVIEW

Our two fine planets of a month ago, Venus in the eastern dawn and Jupiter in the western twilight, have about gone into hiding for a time. Venus, rising only about half an hour before the sun, and Jupiter, setting around the same time interval after sunset, are lost in the brilliance of this celestial luminary. We shall have to do without them for several weeks.

The little planet Mercury is nearer the sun than the two just mentioned, so is completely blotted out. As soon after sunset as the sky is sufficiently darkened, yellow Saturn may be seen well above the east southeastern horizon. The bright star Spica will be somewhat below it. On April 8 the big round moon will be above Saturn, but on the following evening it will be below this planet. By 10 p.m., or shortly after, red Mars, now quite bright, and it will continue to brighten for nearly a month—will have cleared the skyline in the southeast.

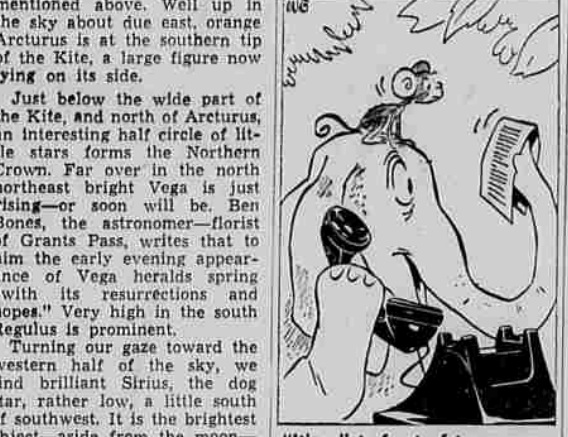
Let us look for the brighter stars around 8 p.m. Spica was mentioned above. Well up in the sky about due east, orange Arcturus is at the southern tip of the Kite, a large figure now lying on its side.

Just below the wide part of the Kite, and north of Arcturus, an interesting half circle of little stars forms the Northern Crown. Far over in the north northeast bright Vega is just rising—or soon will be. Ben Bones, the astronomer—florist of Grants Pass, writes that to him the early evening appearance of Vega heralds spring "with its resurrections and hopes." Very high in the south Regulus is prominent.

Turning our gaze toward the western half of the sky, we find brilliant Sirius, the dog star, rather low, a little south of southwest. It is the brightest object—aside from the moon—in the evening heavens.

Above the horizon in the west southwest the attractive stars of the large Orion group are prominent. The brightest two

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Britain Harnesses Wind To Get Electric Power

LONDON—(AP)—Britain is harnessing the winds to generate electric power. The plan is to set up a chain of giant windmills along Britain's coastline stretching from the Orkneys in the north through the Hebrides and West Scotland to West Wales and then down to Cornwall in the south. Preliminary tests have been completed and 60 suitable sites selected.

The first of the wind-driven power generators is to be built in Caernarvonshire. Research on using winds to generate electricity has been carried on in Britain for four years. The generators will be in the form of windmills 250 feet high, each capable of producing electricity at the rate of 1,000 kilowatts.

BUT CAN IT BE FOUND IN THE BIBLE?



People often indignantly demand that Catholics prove their teaching from the Bible.

And the widespread distribution of the Bible as we know it today was impossible until the invention of printing, some 1400 years after the Savior's death.

By what "rule of faith" did the

millions of Christians during those 1500 years? The answer is that the teaching of the Church was the rule of faith for the Christian world. And St. Paul reminds that Christianity comes from "one Lord, one Faith, one Baptism" (Eph. IV:5). "God of peace, not of wrath," St. Paul said further (1 Cor. XIV:33).

Yet today we have nearly different religious denominations in the United States, all claiming themselves Christian... all interpreting the Bible as their rule of faith... and all differing to some extent or another in their understanding of what the Bible means. Christ have left a "rule of faith" that would permit such contradictions? Would He have left the interpretation of His Word to the changing judgments of men when our very souls depend on correct understanding and observance of the things Christ taught us?

Because this question is so important... because it concerns matter what a man believes... invite you to examine the faith of the first Christians... that is still maintained by the Catholic Church.
