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Roberts Urges Rich Vitality Of Christianity

"We need the philosophy of Easter... the philosophy of the fresh start," the Rev. Carroll C. Roberts, pastor of the First Christian Church of Eugene, told the Eugene Kiwanis Club Monday.

In an Easter address, the Rev. Roberts decried what he called the prevalent materialistic trend in thinking and warned this is leading to a "pagan hedonism prompted by the philosophy of 'eat, drink, and be merry for tomorrow we die'."

He said this outlook makes an empty, purposeless life as contrasted to the "rich vital" answer of Christianity.

The address was preceded by two songs by James Cornett, associate pastor of the church: "I walked today where Jesus walked," (O'Hara) and "Before the Crucifix" (LaForge).

Kiwanian Walter Garrett was awarded a trophy from the Oregon Trail Council of the Boy Scouts of America in recognition of his services to the Community Chest and to scouting. The trophy, a bronze statuette of a Boy Scout, was presented by Dr. E.D. Furrer. Garrett is a past president of the Lane County Chest.
