

NEW YORK — (AP) — A steel spokesman asserted Wednesday night that the company had paid off its debt to the CIO in the steel industry.

Charles B. Randall, president of the Inland Steel Co., called the company's seizure of the steel industry a "corrupt political deal."

He said, without precedent in American history, that the company had paid off its debt to the CIO in the steel industry.

RANDALL'S no-holds-barred attack on the steel industry's first formal seizure of the steel industry was over four major radio and television networks.

By seizure, Randall said, was "without the slightest shadow of legal right."

Operating on his "corrupt political deal" statement, Randall said the principals was the Stabilization Board which recommended a 17½ cents an increase for the CIO Steelworkers.

Boat guides who will run the swift-flowing McKenzie River Sunday in their annual "White Water Parade" are members of an association which enjoys a worldwide reputation.

Organized in 1932, the McKenzie River Guides Assn. currently has only 22 members. But fishermen, magazines and newsreels have spread the fame of their organization.

To be eligible for membership an applicant must have had at least three years of boating experience—two of them on the McKenzie—in addition to passing the state's examination for licensed guides.

The association also requires each member to have a safe McKenzie-type boat, equipped with extra oar and oar locks and life preserver cushions.

Sample increases: applesauce, a penny a can; canned apples, two cents; ordinary size cans of apple juice and cider, four cents; big cans, five cents.

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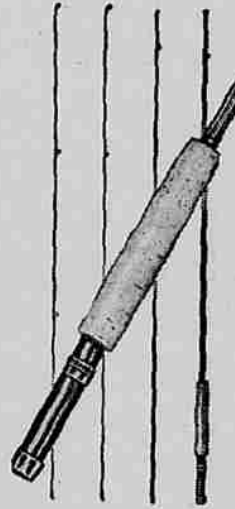
