Students to Hear Lowdown on Jobs

Complete information about 29 different occupations will be given to 381 seniors of Eugene, University, and St. Francis high schools on Friday, May 2, when the Eugene Rotary Club sponsors its first Vocational Information Day.

The event will be held at the Erb Memorial Student Union and will consist of a general assembly, luncheon, and three 50-minute periods at which time 12 different vocations will be discussed by qualified speakers after which students' questions will be answered. Each student will have the opportunity to hear about three occupations.
