

Recalled Pilots Stage Sit-Down

Striking Fliers Face Stiff Action

SAN ANTONIO, Tex.—(AP)—Residual of six lieutenants at Randolph Air Force Base to fly caused a flurry of excitement in this big air force center Friday.

The Air Force said only six fliers were involved in the "sit down strike," but there were reports others had asked for voluntary suspension from flying.

Those refusing to fly were World War II combat fliers, called back to duty as reservists.

SOME OF THOSE asking voluntary suspension from flying were said to have argued that they served in the last war and now are married. Some said they had children to consider.

Maj. Gen. J. K. Lacey, commanding general of the crew training air force, indicated in a formal statement fliers who refused to fly face stiff action.

Maj. Albert Hatcher, public information officer, said one of the fliers who refused to go aloft faced court martial charges of disorderly conduct.

THE SAN ANTONIO Evening News said the man was reported to have insisted the men had no complaint against the planes but had changed their attitude toward flying since World War II and were afraid to fly.

The San Antonio Light said "Maintenance of planes at the base has been under fire in recent months."

Since activation of the B-29 training program at the base in August, 1950, eight of the bombers have crashed. Fifteen airmen were killed, two collided in the air north of San Antonio last month.

Officer Plans Glider Test

EPHRATA, Wash.—(AP)—A young Air Force captain has said he will attempt a new world's record this summer for endurance gliding.

Capt. Earl Drew, a weather officer at Larson Air Force Base and a veteran of 2500 flying hours, said he hoped to stay aloft in his second-hand sail plane for more than 52 hours—the record for a two-place glider.

Drew hopes to attempt the goal in July or August over Wenatchee and the Columbia Basin area. He considers the area one of the best on the continent for sail plane flight because of air currents from the mountains and the strong air bubbles which rise from the hot surface of the earth.

Truce Delegates Hold One-Minute Session

MUNSAN, Korea.—(AP)—United Nations and Communist truce negotiators went through the merest flicker of the motions Saturday, each waiting for the other to suggest a compromise.

"They've got to give," said Maj. Gen. William K. Harrison, United Nations sub-delegate.

Communists showed no signs of yielding. At each of the seven brief sessions this week they suggested a recess unless the U.N. Command had something to propose.

Saturday's meeting took only one minute, to the surprise of observers. Total time for the seven sessions is 33 minutes. They would have taken less time if the generals didn't have to wait for translations.

Two Candidates Eyed As Ike's Successor

WASHINGTON — (AP) — The Pentagon Saturday began preparing for a presidential request that it recommend a successor to Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower as top European Commander, with the choice apparently narrowed down to Gen. Matthew B. Ridgway and Gen. Alfred M. Guenther.

Technically Gen. Eisenhower's successor could come from any of the armed services, but the prospects are he will be an Army man and possibly either Ridgway, supreme commander of the United Nations forces in Japan and Korea — chosen by President Truman when he ousted Gen. Douglas MacArthur — or Guenther, Eisenhower's present chief of staff.

Hanford Plant Schedules Layoff of 1000 Men

RICHLAND — (AP) — More than 1000 workers will be laid off Monday when the \$180 million construction program at the Sanford atomic plant goes on a five-day week.

E. B. Skeels, general manager at Atkinson-Jones Construction Co., said the 20 per cent payroll cut was the beginning of a gradual tapering-off of work on the present project.

The program has been on a six-day week since April 23, 1950.
