Brooklynite To Make Debut

HOLLYWOOD — The longest route to Hollywood recognition was traveled by a Brooklyn-born ex-G.I., Bonar Colleano, who stayed in England after the war and gained fame on the British stage and screen before winning his first American role. He has been signed by the Kramer Company for the top role of Colucci in "The Dirty Dozen" to be directed by Edward Dmytryk at Columbia. This will be Bonar Colleano's second association with Dmytryk, the director having chosen the actor in London to play in "Salt to the Devil."

Colleano also played an important part in "Sleeping Car to Trieste" and later won the top role in "Pool of London." He was chosen by Laurence Olivier to play opposite Vivien Leigh in the London stage production of "A Streetcar Named Desire," playing the role which Marlon Brando created on the New York stage.

Newfoundland Attracts European Immigrants

ST. JOHN'S, Nfld. (AP)—Newfoundland government spokesmen say they are being swamped by requests from would-be European immigrants who want to settle on the booming island.

The requests, coming from Britain, France, Germany, Holland and Belgium, all carry the same plea.

The sender wants help from Premier Joseph Smallwood's government to cut the immigration red tape. All have digested the publicity in Europe for Newfoundland's multi-million-dollar economic development program.

To those from war-ravaged countries, Canada's 10th province represented the land of milk and honey.

Most of the requests, the government said, had to be ignored.

Even the ever-increasing number of immigrants who reached Canada every month weren't being encouraged to settle in Newfoundland unless they could work as instructors, helping native residents acquire technical skills. The government pointed out that, despite the fact that new industries sprang up all over the island in 1951 and were scheduled to do so again this year, jobs still were at a premium.
