Boy Scouts and their leaders are co-operating with the Willamette National Forest by planting trees for the forest's sustained yield program. Foresters at the Eugene office said planting of trees in areas that are not naturally reseeded is of major importance in their program.

In the Fall Creek area of West Boundary District 27, Scouts under the leadership of Scoutmaster Jerry Shepherd, troop No. 177, Eugene, planted 2500 Douglas Fir seedlings in March. On April 12, 20 Scouts of troop No. 69, Eugene, with their Scoutmaster Bill Schroeder planted 2000 Douglas fir trees on Fall Creek.

They were assisted by Carl Juhl and John Riley of West Boundary. The boys were told that if a good work of planting was done they could come back in later years to view the results of their efforts.

Scouts have planted 15,000 trees at Fall Creek in the last four years.

Their sparkling-eyed children
 will be taken from their unedu-
 cated parents and sent to state
 schools to learn trades. Their par-
 ents will be persuaded by various
 pressures to leave their caravans
 and lazy card-playing and put to
 work in factories producing for
 the "great peoples' democracies."

This is the Communist plan be-
 ing carried out, according to re-
 ports reaching Vienna, on the
 Hungarian plains and in the wood-
 ed mountains of Czechoslovakia
 and Romania where thousands of
 Czigany have wandered for cen-
 turies.

Reports from behind the Iron
 Curtain, however, say that the
 Communists are not finding it
 easy to tame the light-living
 Gypsies and integrate them into
 the expanding Communist indus-
 trial machine.

IN HUNGARY, the government

 come farmers.

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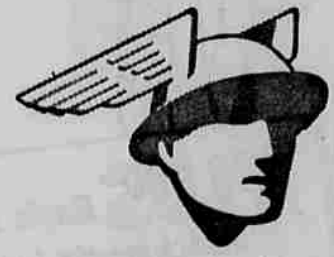
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
