Methodists Hold
Policy Conference

SAN FRANCISCO—Religion is being used as a cafeteria to obtain material instead of spiritual needs, The Rev. Ralph W. Sockman of New York told the Methodist General Conference Sunday.

Assailing those who ask God for material things, Dr. Sockman said: "Many pulpits try to make religion popular by presenting it as the best way of preserving our economic system. Prayer is advocated because it secures for us financial success and social acceptability. The church must rise above the current emphasis on religion as security and revive its original gospel of salvation."

Calling the church the best defense against Communism, he continued:

"But if we support the church only as an insurance for our property and practice prayer only as a means to success, then we are materialistic even as are the Communists. We are in danger of demeaning the soul-saving church of Christ with a self-serving cafeteria for our physical needs."

The Methodist General Conference which opened Wednesday meets every four years to legislate church policy. Attending are 70 bishops, active and retired, and 720 elected delegates representing at least 25 countries.

CAPRI, Italy—(AP)—Mussolini's granddaughter is going to marry a descendant of Napoleon's niece, thus uniting the families of two bygone dictators.

The engagement was disclosed Friday night by Mussolini's daughter, Edda Clano, mother of the bride-to-be. She did not announce the wedding date.

The couple are Faimonda Clano, pretty 19-year-old brunette, and Sandra Giunta, 23, a descendant of Princess Julia Bonaparte. They met in Rome last month. Giunta said it was love at first sight.

Eugene Senior Gains Award

A Fulbright fellowship has been awarded to Catherine Black, Eugene, senior in liberal arts, for study at the University of Toulouse, in Toulouse, France, during the coming academic year.

The fellowship, which Miss Black won in national competition, will provide her tuition, living and travel expenses. She will study modern French literature, principally poetry, in relation to modern American poetry.

Big Celebration Awaits Eisenhower's July Visit

DENVER—(P)—Dwight and Mamie Eisenhower will be returning to her home and his favorite vacation land when they come to Denver in June, but there most resemblance to past visits will cease.

They've always slipped in quietly and settled down at the big, old brick home of her parents, the John Sheldon Doud's. Gen. Eisenhower was here last at Christmas time, 1950. Mrs. Eisenhower flew home last summer for her father's funeral.

OLD NEIGHBORS in quiet old East Denver still recall the Eisenhower wedding in 1918. It was in front of the mantel in the spacious two-story Doud house.

They still can picture a stern young lieutenant stepping off the wide porch to chase neighborhood children off the high terrace, then grinning and joining the game.

This time there will be little chance for play, for the fishing and golfing the general likes; little time for him to paint in the makeshift studio in the garage behind the house.

The Eisenhowers won't slip in quietly, either. Denver leaders are planning bands, confetti, speeches and perhaps the largest crowd in downtown history for a welcoming parade.

Gov. Dan Thornton, wealthy Republican cattleman and an Eisenhower booster, will be their official host. He plans to meet the general in Abilene, Kan., June 4.

THORNTON EXPECTS Eisenhower to spend two days in conferences there or on the East coast, then come to Denver June 7 to stay until the Republican National Convention opens in Chicago a month later.

"Maybe he'll get in a week-end fishing at my ranch in Gunnison and there may be a few rounds of golf, but the general plans to keep long working hours through each week," Thornton said.

Backers of Eisenhower for the GOP presidential nomination are arranging a headquarters (with office, press and conference rooms) in the famed old Brown Palace Hotel.

Bureau's Figures Show Lower Food Prices

A preliminary report compiled by the University of Oregon Bureau of Business Research from early figures released by the U. S. Bureau of Labor Statistics shows that Portland housewives paid lower prices on 24 of 54 foods tabulated during mid-April than they did in mid-March.

The report also shows that higher prices were paid for 23 other foods, and the same price for the remaining seven. Fresh fruits and vegetables, for the most part, were higher, while fats and oil prices were lower.

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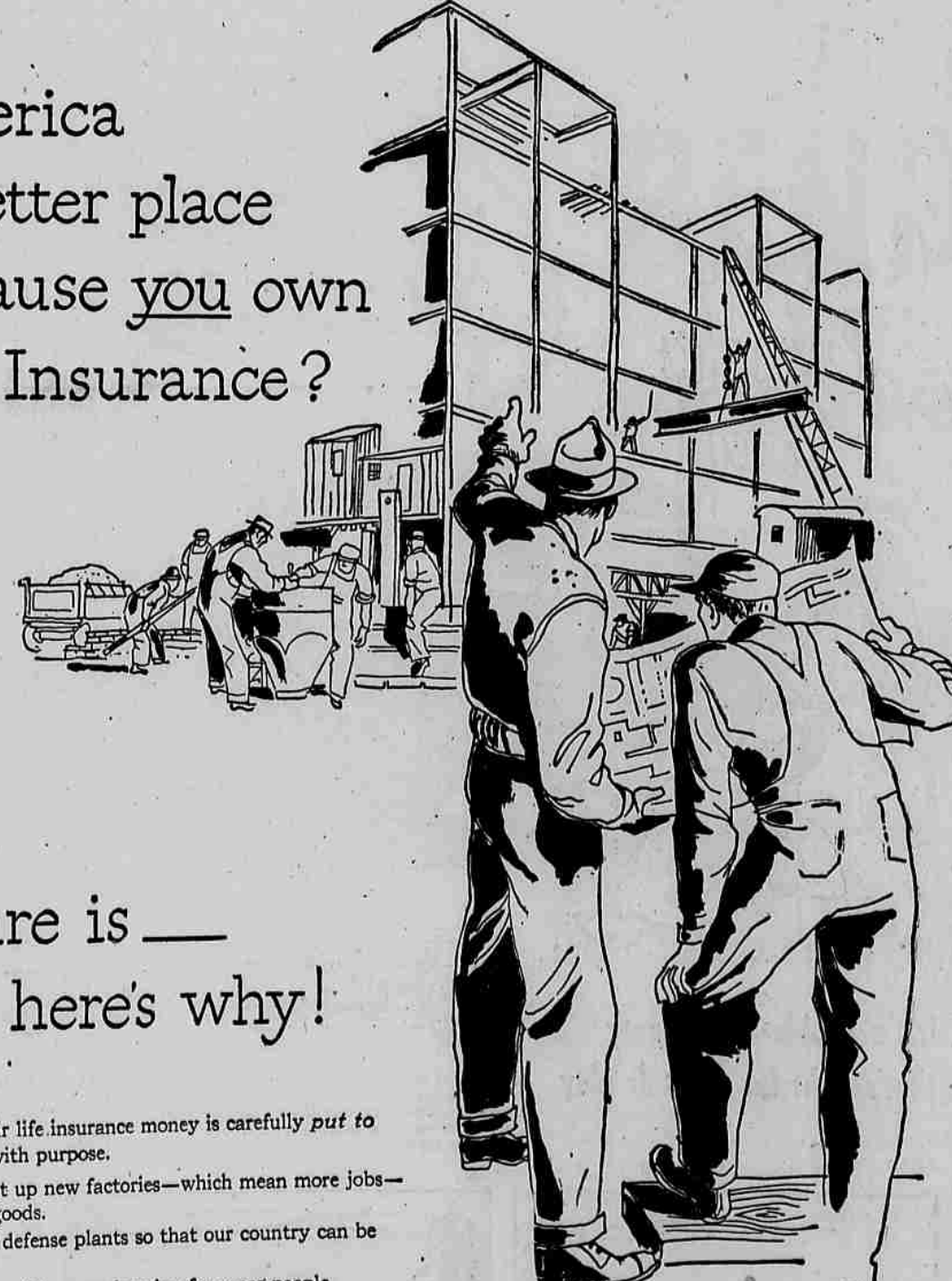
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
