\$19 Million Railroad Job Around Dam Nearly Done

LOWELL — The date for driving the golden spike to mark completion of the new Southern Pacific railroad line around Lookout Point Dam and Reservoir will be about July 1, according to latest information.

At that time it is expected the Corps of Engineers, U.S. Army, will present the new line to Southern Pacific in ceremonies fitting to the occasion.

The line change was made necessary to lift the railroad above the dam and its impounded waters. The old tracks are on the north side of the Willamette River, the new line on the south side.

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houses for the three regular and one relief operator, a section foreman's house and two units for laborers, as at Trent. Water supply will be taken from Minnow Creek and carried through one mile of pipe to a 140,000 gallon tank to service engines and for domestic use. Water to the houses will pass through a chlorinator plant.

Signals to tell of approaching trains are being installed all along the line. These have a black target-drum containing the light and replace the semaphore signals used on the old line.

All switches are spring type with the exception of one power switch at the Portland end of Minnow siding. The old models have to be unlocked then hand turned.

POWER CONTROLLED switches operated from a station are in use at four points on the Cascade line above Oakridge where the tracks are on a long curve or near a tunnel mouth.

The new line crosses the river just above Jasper on a bridge 811 feet long which boasts three 80 foot girders, two 150 foot trusses and one 250 foot truss in the center. The upper bridge is 779 feet

long (pictured) has three girders 90 feet each and three 80 foot plus one 250 foot truss over the main stream.

The track passes over Lost Creek Road back of Meridian Shopping Center, Rattlesnake Road back of Trent and another on the "flat" near Jasper bridge. There are also two overfill structures (fill and culvert) over Lost Creek—80 and 160 feet long respectively, and the big overpass at the damsite where the track crosses Highway 58. One of the largest fills in United States crosses Lost Creek Valley.

Lookout Point Constructors who have the last contract for steel and ballast are employing approximately 100 men. A diesel powered locomotive is used to pull their work train of 20 cars. Signal installers are following right behind the track gangs.

UTAH CONSTRUCTION Co. finished the first eight miles of track last fall, after the first contract on clearing was let in 1947.

A twin project of the relocation has been building a new grade for highway 58, to also put it above the lake. The costs are born by the government.

Power Official Hits Opponents

SEATTLE — (P) — The president of the Northwest Public Power Assn. Monday criticized the governors of Washington, Oregon and Idaho for their stands against proposed construction of Hells Canyon Dam on the Snake River.

Owen W. Hurd told the association at its annual meeting the governors were siding with the Idaho Power Co. in its efforts "to maintain a monopoly in Southern Idaho."

Hurd, manager of the Benton County, Wash., Public Utility District, also listed several members of the Pacific-Northwest congressional delegation as variously friendly and unfriendly to public power.

"More leadership is needed of the type supplied by Senators Morse of Oregon, Magnuson of Washington and Murray of Montana, and less of the type supplied by Senators Ecton of Montana, Cain of Washington, and Welker and Dworshak of Idaho," he said.
