

Pepper Supports Kefauver in Test

MIAMI, Fla.—(P)—Former Sen. Claude Pepper of Florida Sunday threw his political influence behind Sen. Estes Kefauver in the lanky Tennessee's big bid for Southern support in Tuesday's Democratic presidential preference primary.

Pepper's announcement came just as Kefauver and Sen. Richard B. Russell of Georgia, Kefauver's opponent in the state's popularity contest—were preparing to make their final campaign pleas in populous Dade (Miami) County after swings through northern and central Florida.

KEFAUVER supporters were hopeful Pepper's still-potent political influence might shift the balance of voting power and give them an important victory in the South.

Pepper was defeated for renomination to the Senate in 1950 by Sen. George Smathers, who is supporting Russell. But despite the defeat he is conceded to have a strong following in Florida.

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THIS WAS a reference to the fact that Pepper is backing a block of delegates entered as Russell supporters in Florida's second primary on May 27. The state's 24 delegates to the Democratic national convention will be chosen in this primary.

As a follow-up to Pepper's announcement, one-time crime buster Rudolph Halley—now president of New York City's city council—appealed to Florida voters to support Kefauver and bring about "a moral revival in government."

Halley was chief counsel of the Kefauver crime investigating committee.

Dog Identifies Master's Killer

BUENOS AIRES.—(P)—A black mongrel dog, was found grieving recently by the body of his master, Demetrio Saurez, 45, a garden worker who was stabbed to death.

The dog was taken to police headquarters where suspects in the case were being held. When Ismael Romero, 24, appeared, Falucho tried to attack him. Romero later admitted stabbing Saurez in an argument.

Chinese-Born Woman Named Mother of Year

NEW YORK.—(P)—Mrs. Toy Len Goon, Chinese-born owner-operator of a Portland, Me., Laundry and mother of eight American born children, was named the American Mother for 1952 Monday by the Golden Rule Foundation.

Mrs. Goon, 57, widow of a World War I veteran, had no formal education, the Foundation said. Her children, ranging in age from 15 to 29, include a doctor, a merchant, a teacher, a government worker, and a member of the United States Navy. Two are in school; another is working in the family laundry to earn money for further schooling.

The doctor son is Carroll Goon, 29, Salt Lake City.

"Her personal participation in civic affairs was limited because of her continuous duties in her laundry and her home," the American Mothers Committee of the Foundation said. "As her children grew up they helped their mother in the laundry. They were taught and encouraged constantly to participate in worthwhile civic projects of all kinds."

Mrs. Goon has been a resident of the United States for almost 40 years and is an American citizen. Her husband, Dogan Goon, lost a leg after he was discharged from service in World War I. He died 12 years ago.

6 Red Planes Lost in Combat

Enemy Changing MIGs' Armament

SEOUL, Korea.—(P)—U. S. Sabre jet pilots destroyed four Communist jets and two Red propeller-driven planes in aerial dog-fights over Northwestern Korea Sunday, the Fifth Air Force reported Monday.

There were three clashes in the area just south of the Yalu River boundary between Korea and Manchuria. The fights ranged from 40,000 feet down to 5,000.

FOUR RED jets were shot down as 30 Sabres jumped a 12-plane MIG formation. Earlier, Sabre pilots swooped down on two low-flying Red planes of conventional design and downed them.

In a third scrap, two Australian Meteor jet pilots tangled with two MIG 15s and reported one MIG probably destroyed.

Allied losses, if any, will be announced in a weekly summary. The smashing Sunday air victories were tempered by the Air Force announcement that Col. Albert W. Schinz, deputy wing commander of the 51st Fighter-Interceptor Wing, disappeared in aerial combat May 1.

MAJ. DONALD E. Adams, who Saturday became America's 13th jet ace, said the Communists have begun to replace 23-mm. cannon on Russian-type MIG-15s with machineguns similar to the U. S. 50 caliber.

Ten B-29 superforts reported only meager flak Sunday night as they bombed the Chongju rail bridge complex in Northwestern Korea between Sinuiju, on the Yalu River, and Sinanju to the south.

Truce Negotiators Hold 11-Minute Meeting

MUNSAN, Korea.—(P)—Allied and Communist truce delegates produced no signs of headway in an 11-minute secret session Monday.

It appeared both sides had run out of things to say in the Korean armistice deadlock.

North Korean Gen. Nam Il, chief Red delegate, spoke from notes for nine of the 11 minutes in session at Panmunjom.

Then he proposed a recess until Tuesday at 11 a. m.

Vice Adm. Turner Joy, head of the Allied delegation, emerged from the conference tent and said:

"I am sorry but we are still in executive secret session and I can tell you nothing. We meet again tomorrow."

An Allied spokesman said Nam opened the meeting with a brief remark to which Joy responded. Then Nam spoke from prepared notes.

The secret sessions of the chief delegates began one week ago when the United Nations Command laid before the Reds a proposed over-all solution to unsettled problems.

These are focused on prisoner exchange and also include Communist nomination of Soviet Russia as a neutral armistice observer and an Allied demand for a ban on rehabilitation of military airfields during a truce.

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
