Two Springfield Churches Will Show Moody Institute's Movies



"STAR OF STAGE," Screen, and Radio, may be the dream of this bat, but actually he is being used for a series of laboratory experiments unfolding the bat's radar secret to night flying. This ingenious instinct of the bat is a feature in "Dust or Destiny," a Moody Institute of Science production to be shown at the Trinity Baptist Church on Sunday (May 18) at 3 p.m.

A bird that travels more than 20,000 miles a year—from the south pole in winter, to the north pole in summer—is one of the marvels of nature shown in "Dust or Destiny," religious-science film to be presented at the Trinity Baptist Church, 12th and "B" St., on Sunday, May 18, at 3 p.m., according to Rev. C. R. Barrow, D.D., pastor.

Twice a year making an uncharted flight that few human pilots would dare to attempt, the Arctic tern is probably the greatest of all migrant birds. Through some mysterious knowledge, the tern navigates from one pole to the other without any of the complicated instruments required by man, as described in the film.

Also told is the story of the homing pigeon. In addition, the film portrays the Pacific golden plover's annual pilgrimage from Alaska to the Hawaiian Islands, a mere pin-point in the ocean, and the American plover's amazing flight from northern Canada to Labrador and then down into Argentina.

"Dust or Destiny" is fourth in a series of sermons from science produced by Moody Bible Institute, Chicago. An important part of the armed forces character guidance program, these films are being shown all over the world.

New Program On KASH Air

Unitarians Will Hear Speaker From India

Sir C. P. Ramaswami Aiyar will be guest speaker at the morning service of the Eugene Unitarian Church tomorrow. His topic will be "Contemporary Hinduism." He also speaks at the Congregational Church 9:30 a.m. service.

Sir C. P. was prime minister of the State of Travancore, India from 1936-1947 and is one of India's greatest living diplomats as well as an authority on Hindu culture. He has held numerous high posts in the Indian government, many of them concerned with the improvement of India's legal structure and the unification of India. He was a member of the Indian National Congress, and its All-India secretary, 1917-18.

He has been chairman of the Indian Rubber Production Board and of the Travancore Steam Navigation Company. In 1948-49 he was president of the Nilgiri Rotary Club. He has also been a member of the government of India Central Board of Education and Chief Commissioner of the Travancore Boy Scout Association.

He has contributed to various periodicals on political, philosophical, financial and literary topics, and was a delegate to the East and West philosophy conference in Honolulu, 1949.

The Eugene Unitarian Church is able to have the opportunity of hearing Sir C. P. because of his presence on the University of Oregon campus as the Oregon Conference on Philosophy of Religion and the Northwest Conference on Religion in Higher Education.
