Music Treat At Grove Sunday Eve

COTTAGE GROVE — C. Griffith Bratt, organist, will play the dedicatory recital on the new pipe organ at the First Presbyterian Church, Sunday, May 11 at 8 p.m. Bratt is a graduate of the Peabody Conservatory of Music in Baltimore, and is at present head of the Music Department in Boise Junior College, Boise, Idaho, and organist-choirmaster of St. Michael's Episcopal Cathedral in that city.

He has been chosen this year to be the guest recitalist at the biennial convention of the American Guild of Organists in its meeting at San Francisco. In the past he has played recitals in Washington, D. C., and in Baltimore, as well as frequent recitals in Idaho, Washington, and Oregon. He is not only an organist but a composer.

The new pipe organ, which was built for the Presbyterian Church by the M. U. Moller Co. of Hagerstown, Maryland, is said to be the finest pipe organ in a small church in Oregon. It was built especially for the new building, in consultation with Pietro Belluschi, the architect. It has two manuals and five sets of pipes, including Disposition, Gedackt, Violoncello, Trumpet and Bourdon, a total of 365 pipes. Plans are to add three more sets at a later date. Bratt's program is planned to bring out the various capabilities of the organ. Of special interest will be the "Trumpet Tune and Air" by Purcell, "The Great Fugue" by Bach and the "Fantasy on 'A Mighty Fortress'"—one of his own compositions.

The concert is sponsored by a number of interested members and friends of the church, whose contributions have provided for the expense of the recital. It is open to the general public without charge. A special offering will be taken for the organ fund. A series of further concerts is also being planned, to be played by organists from our own area, and will be announced soon.
