

Reds Continue Peace Demands

Propaganda Said Part of Scheme

PANMUNJOM, Korea — (U.P.) — An Allied spokesman accused Communist truce negotiators Tuesday of making violent propaganda charges in the hope of dictating a Korean armistice on their own terms.

Brig. Gen. William P. Nuckols said the Communist delegates apparently are acting on orders from higher authorities in accusing the United Nations of atrocities against prisoners of war.

North Korean Lt. Gen. Nam Il spent 31 minutes of the 35-minute meeting reiterating these charges and making a "serious protest" against the alleged strafing of Red truce convoys. He said one soldier had been killed in a U.N. plane attack on a truce convoy Monday.

"It's now obvious that their present course of action shows they don't want an armistice except on terms completely dictated by them," Nuckols said.

The official Chinese radio at Peiping appeared to bear this out. It said the armistice talks had reached a "serious crisis."

Radio Peiping said the U.N. could save the talks from collapse only by dropping its "vicious scheme" to return only 70,000 of the 169,000 Communist war prisoners and civilian internees in Allied hands.

The U.N. contends that the remaining 99,000 prisoners and internees would forcibly resist repatriation and it refused to make any go back against their will. Nuckols said the U.N. promised to investigate the strafing incident.

Plunges Into Concrete

PULASKI, Tenn. — (U.P.) — A young construction worker fell 40 feet into a mass of freshly-poured concrete and steel reinforcing bars Monday and was dug out dead about an hour later.

Oil Shortage Grounds Planes

WASHINGTON — (P) — Come rain, hail, strike in the oil industry, shows at the nation's military air bases next Saturday will go on—but without plane flights.

The Defense Department has grounded aviation phases of the annual Armed Forces Day celebrations, so there will be none of the engine roar and blast, none of the spectacular air dashes and flypasts of previous years.

Secretary of Defense Lovett last week, in view of the current fuel shortage, cancelled all flying activities previously scheduled by the Army, Navy and Air Force in observance of Armed Forces Day.

Lovett said aviation activity should be limited to open house and fixed displays. However, aircraft can be flown to a center for use in a ground display.

Shot of Whisky Works Wonder On Old Dobbin

OLYMPIA — (P) — When old Dobbin fell into a well here, Fire Chief Harry Lynch prescribed whisky.

And it worked. The horse was wallowing in about two feet of mud and six inches of water when discovered. Police and bystanders dug down one side of the well so the horse could come up a slope instead of a sheer wall if it could get out of the mud.

Then they followed the fire chief's advice, gave the animal a shot of whisky and tugged on a rope. Out came the horse.

"It was an old custom to treat horses in the fire service with a snort of red-eye when they were in distress," said Fire Chief Lynch. "That's what gave the horse the final energy to get out."

Allies Lay Fire On Red Troops

Airmen Destroy 5 Commie Jets

SEOUL, Korea — (P) — U.S. Airmen Tuesday destroyed five Communist jets, probably shot down two and damaged six in a half dozen battles over North Korea, the Fifth Air Force said.

The Air Force credited Sabre jets pilots with all the kills and probables and three of the damage claims.

Thunderjet fighter bomber pilots were credited with the three other damaged planes—two MIGs and the other a rarely seen new Red "type 15" jet.

The U.S. Eighth Army said ground troops killed at least 100 Reds in patrol skirmishes.

THE ARMY said the U.S. First Marine Division is holding a sector of the Western front near the armistice conference village, Panmunjom.

It said the Leathernecks moved into the area from Central and Eastern front positions a month ago. They replaced the South Korean First Division which held the sector 18 months.

Allied warships bombarded Eastern and Western coasts of North Korea.

A Navy summary said the Destroyer James C. Owen and the destroyer-mine sweeper Doyle laid day and night fire on enemy gun positions in the Songjin area on the East Coast.

THE HEAVY Cruiser Bremerton used her eight-inch guns for the first time, the Navy said, on Communist front line positions near the East Coast.

MOSCOW — (P) — Big crowds lined up at movie theatres here Monday to see Johnny Weissmuller in the first showing of the third sequel of his "Tarzan" pictures. The pictures are the most successful foreign movies ever shown in the Soviet Union.

Deer Charges Bring Fines, Jail Sentences

Three McKenzie Bridge men were fined a total of \$800 and given jail sentences amounting to 150 days by Carl Lewis, Springfield Justice, Monday. The arrests were made by state police.

Dean Howard Hancock, 21, was fined \$300 and given a 30-day sentence for spotlighting deer. A \$50 fine and 30 more days were levied against him for petty larceny.

Wesley Bull Johnson, 19, was fined \$350 and given 60 days in jail for spotlighting. He, too, was given \$50 and 30 days for petty larceny.

Scott Witcher, 26, was fined \$50 for possession of venison. State police said Hancock and Johnson killed a doe deer and left it in the woods, coming back occasionally to cut meat from it. But before it could be consumed, a bobcat found it.

The petty larceny charge concerned gasoline and logging equipment taken from Horne and Payne Logging Co. of Blue River.

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Fraud Charge 'Booms' at UO

All the political artillery booming in the background was just "background music" as far as University of Oregon student politicians were concerned Tuesday.

They were concerned about their own student body election and a hearing which might tell them is something really turned sour April 30, their election day.

Losers in the student body election have charged fraud. Winners have denied it. The case is now before the student body's constitutional committee.

In the election, Pat Dignan of Gold Beach, a candidate of the Associated Greek Student's Party, won the student body presidency. He defeated Helen Jackson, of Klamath Falls, candidate of the United Students' Assn.



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Cripple Loses Appeal

OTTAWA (UP) — The Canadian Supreme Court dismissed Monday the appeal of crippled Watchmaker Genereux Ruest and ruled that he must hang July 25 for making a time-bomb that blew up an airliner in 1949, killing 23 persons.

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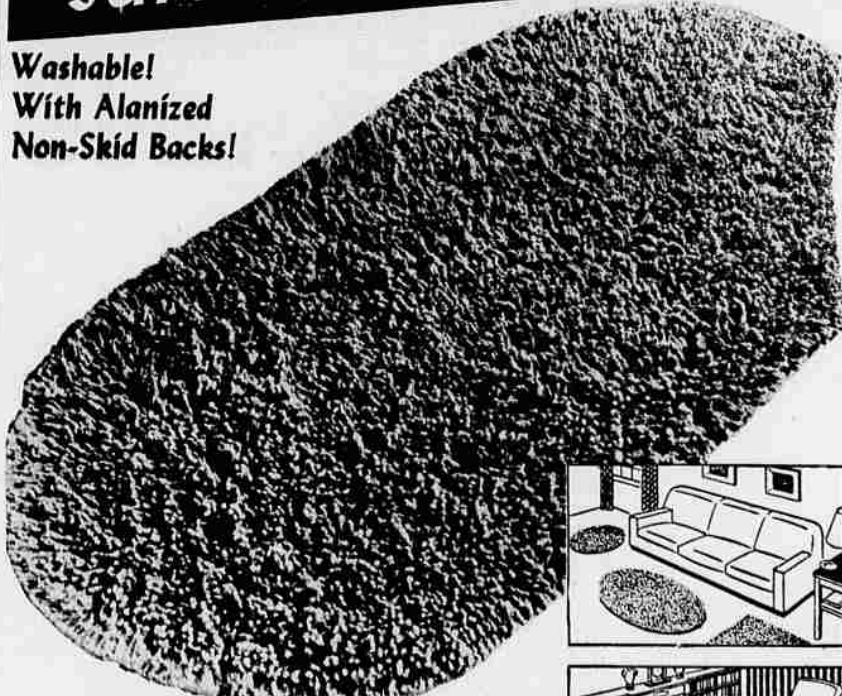
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
