

Hoffman Says Ike Qualities Make Him Best Candidate

General Dwight D. Eisenhower, whose qualities make him the best candidate for the United States presidency, was the chief backer told a large audience Tuesday.

Hoffman, former head of the Economic Co-operation Administration, who described himself as an "amateur politician" on the "amateur political" crowd of the University of the Pacific in the University of the Pacific. He was the second of the four heavyweights who will have their say on the campus by primary vote Friday, and the first time a Tuesday double bill. Hoffman said, and he would be the last man Stalin would care to "tangle with."

In time the Kremlin leaders might be convinced that "the game is up," he stated, though it would be a "fantastically difficult problem" to convince the Russian people that the real aims of the U. S. are for peace.

HOFFMAN BRUSHED ASIDE the fear that the general's military background might make him unfit for the presidency. Both in his talk and in the question period which followed it he stressed Eisenhower's civilian background and civilian thinking. And in his present job as head of SHAPE, his tasks have been primarily those of diplomacy, he said.

"No one but a man of terrific genius could get the representatives of 14 countries together to do anything," Hoffman added. The discussion in the question period following the talk moved onto more touchy ground. Hoffman found it necessary to make it clear that he favored Eisenhower and no one else in answer to a pointed remark about "dark horse candidates," obviously aimed at him.

Hoffman asserted, the must pick up the bulk of the vote and crack the electoral lines themselves. Polls indicated that only Eisenhower has the appeal to attract a vote, he added. Hoffman said, "I am willing to predict, a la Eisenhower, that General Eisenhower can carry five southern states."

On the second point, that of going back to the old American way of freedom, Hoffman said Eisenhower can lead the way out of the "smog of fear and amorality." It's time to turn to an atmosphere of freedom to think, to speak and to act, the former ECA head said. Eisenhower is also free from "breath of scandal," Hoffman said. He is a man of total integrity and demands total integrity of every associate, he declared.

Clinicians Get Jail Sentence

PORTLAND — (U.P.) — Circuit Judge Martin Hawkins Tuesday sentenced Dr. Ruth Barnett, Portland naturopath, and Dr. H. G. Weigar, a chiropractor employed by her, to serve six months in the Multnomah County jail for operating a business where unlawful operations were obtained.

The jurist also sentenced Mrs. Edith Weiger and Billy Hillman, employees of Dr. Barnett, to serve three months in the county jail. Judge Hawkins said he would entertain a motion for a new trial or a motion for dismissal for Mary Kinsey, a co-defendant with others in the recent nuisance trial.

He explained that she was convicted on circumstantial evidence. Despite the sentences, none of the defendants will go to jail at present. Defense Attorney Edwin Hicks immediately served notice he would appeal the cases.

The defendants were found guilty on the nuisance charge by a Circuit Court jury last week.
