

Sewer Bond Issue Voted by Council

COTTAGE GROVE — The council Monday night voted unanimously to advertise for bids on a \$225,000 bond issue for the construction of a sewer and drainage system. The total is \$75,000 less than the amount originally proposed. At last Thursday's meeting, the council voted to reject the single offer to purchase bonds of the \$300,000 issue and to re-advertise for bids.

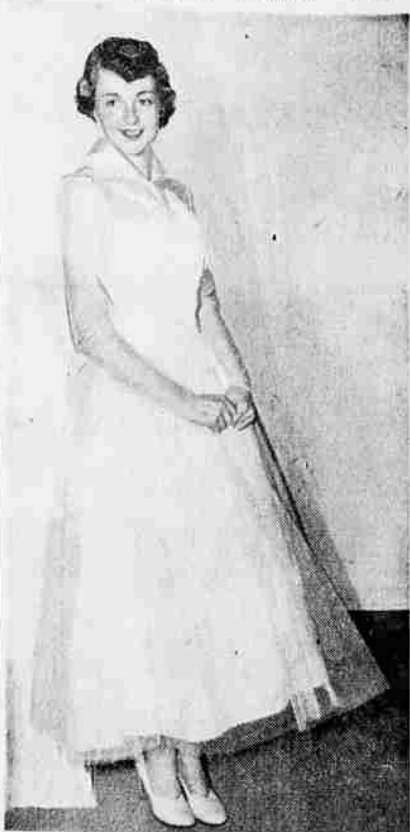
State Official Sent to Prison

Wives Jealous Of Legal Wife Of Ex-Mormon

MESA, Ariz. (U.P.) — George Merlin Dutton, 47-year-old ex-Mormon, was free on bail Monday, but authorities said his days of "open and notorious cohabitation" with six wives were over.

Dutton, sought for five months by Arizona authorities on polygamy charges, was arrested Saturday near Showlow, Ariz., on his way back to the home he once shared with the women and his 19 children.

He also was sought by police in Utah and Wyoming where it was believed he had a few more wives.

When asked where he had been since Jan. 1—the day the six Mrs. Duttons were arrested on charges of "open and notorious cohabitation" with him—the slightly-bald, heavy set Dutton replied tersely that he had been "out of the state."

Dutton was arrested while with his legal wife, Sarah, 43, whom he married in 1950. He was returned here and released from jail on \$1,500 bond.

The appearance of Sarah on the marital scene was reported to Dutton.
