

Bomb Climaxes Panties Raid

30 Girls Overcome
At Arizona College

TUCSON, Ariz. — (AP)—Thirty girls were overcome by smoke Tuesday when a smoke bomb exploded in the basement of the Yavapai Hall on the University of Arizona campus.

Three male students are being held in the basement of the Yavapai Hall.

Sheley Bledsoe, a student from Oklahoma who previously suffered from a lung ailment, had stopped breathing by the time she reached the emergency ward at Mary's Hospital.

SHE WAS revived by oxygen and remained in a serious condition for several hours.

Yavapai Hall was the scene of a "panties raid" last Tuesday night.

Five of the students who allegedly participated were suspended by the university Monday.

None of these youths is believed to have been involved in Tuesday's disturbance.

The smoke bomb apparently was thrown from the National Guard armory.

OF THE 30 girls overcome, four were treated at St. Mary's Hospital, 19 at Tucson Medical center and the remaining 16 at the Arizona Infirmary.

Girls climbed from windows and went down fire exits to escape the smoke-filled building.

Mrs. Bertha Hall, in charge of the dormitory, called the roll outside the building.

As a girl failed to answer, sheriffs deputies would join firemen watching the building and go to the girls' rooms. Occupants were sent outside.

Sales Tumble,
Competitor
Gets Business

DETROIT — (AP) — About a month ago Harry Kohn, who operates Tom Allen's Clothing Store, had a big sign painted across the second-story windows. It read:

The Lowest Prices in Town

His next-door competitor, William Broad, painted across his second story windows in the same letter-style and color:

BOTH SIGNS now appear to read as one.

Well, to make a long story short, the police were called in Monday. It seemed there had been a lot of hot arguments going on.

Kohn told Asst. Pros. Nathan Kaufman his side of the story:

"During this month my sales fell from \$8,000 to \$4,200—all because of the three words Broad painted onto my sign."

Broad said:

"I did it because, according to the agreements, Broad is only supposed to sell men's suits. Now he's selling shirts, neckties and handkerchiefs. And that's my business."

THE ASSISTANT prosecutor baffled. But lawyer-like he dug upon a technicality. He discovered that the window containing the huge block "A" from Broad's "AT" straddles the precise dividing line of the two stores.

So Broad was ordered to remove the portion of the "A" on Kohn's half of the window by 10 a.m. Tuesday or face a trespassing warrant.

Ruled Illegal

NEW ORLEANS — (AP) — U.S. District Judge Herbert Christenberry held Tuesday that jointly published morning and afternoon newspapers cannot require advertisers to buy space in both papers in order to buy space in one.

More than 170 jointly owned morning and afternoon newspapers in the nation presently have such a requirement.

Judge Christenberry's decision was on a government civil anti-trust suit filed against The Times-Picayune Publishing Co., June 14, 1936.

The government contended that business practices of The Times-Picayune Publishing Co., operated in the injury of the competing afternoon New Orleans Item.

University President Returns To Heavy Working Schedule

Like anybody who's been away from the job for five months, Harry K. Newburn had a lot of work to do Tuesday. There was a stack of correspondence and memos on his desk. On the table behind him was another heap of books, papers and bulletins, which he had sent home from Europe.

The University of Oregon president returned Monday from his tour of colleges and universities in the British Isles and Europe. He had a hat-full of impressions, and a lot more ideas which weren't jelled into impressions yet. He took an hour off Tuesday morning to tell the press about them.

HE'S NOT READY, he said, to recommend any immediate change in the American educational picture, based on what he observed in Europe. Nor, he said, does he feel European institutions should adopt American methods immediately.

An educational system, he pointed out, is bound up with the history, culture and mores of a nation. What works in one place perhaps won't work in another.

Nonetheless he found European institutions slowly changing. Most significant, he said, was a development of a "corporate feeling," approaching that in American universities. "Corporate feeling" was the term he used to mean a feeling of community cooperation and living together.

FBI Arrests Corps Workers

TACOMA — (AP) — Two civilian employees of the Army Corps of Engineers were arrested by Federal Bureau of Investigation agents Tuesday on bribery charges.

Special FBI Agent R. D. Auerbach said John Samuel Wilfley, 50, and Manley Powell Bates, 52, both of Tacoma, are accused of accepting a \$1,000 bribe to violate specifications of a million dollar street and paving job at Fort Lewis.

Auerbach said Wilfley was resident engineer on the project and Bates was the chief engineer.

THE TWO MEN were arraigned before U.S. Commissioner Frank Hale and were bound over to the federal grand jury. Each was released in bail of \$2,500.

Auerbach said Wilfley and Bates are charged with seeking a bribe from the Valley Construction Co., of Seattle.

U.S. Attorney Charles J. Dennis said at Seattle the company reported a bribe attempt and FBI agents were present when money was passed at the fort.

THE COMPLAINT said the men "did ask and receive \$1,000 with intent to have their decisions and actions influenced on enforcement of specifications" of the project.

At the arraignment, Wilfley denied having any connection with the transaction. He termed such a bribe ridiculous because "so many people have to be in on the deal that \$1,000 wouldn't go very far."

Bates declined to testify before the commissioner. He said he would tell his story in court.

Previously, he said, there was a little social structure in the student body.

A NEEDY STUDENT who is capable of college work has a better chance to go on with his education than he ever had before, he said of the more than 30 European institutions he and Mrs. Newburn visited. He also said he found state aid to education greatly increased, to a point where many students are subsidized by the government.

President Newburn, who traveled on a combination of a sub-battical leave and a Fulbright program, said the attitude of European educators toward him was "more than just courtesy; they were really helpful."

In the British Isles, France, Germany, Italy and Belgium, he said, "We were treated far more royally than we expected to be." While sometimes, he said, "We had trouble to keep from being over-entertained," he warned that too much must not be read into that statement.

AMERICANS ARE not universally loved and respected in Europe, he pointed out, urging Americans to show they aren't trying to "buy the support of Europe." He urged that Europe be helped to help itself, asserting that support would then follow naturally.

He said he found little basic difference in European and American students. As the American is preoccupied with gathering credits, the European is preoccupied with passing the next examination. Tougher competition in professional life in Europe

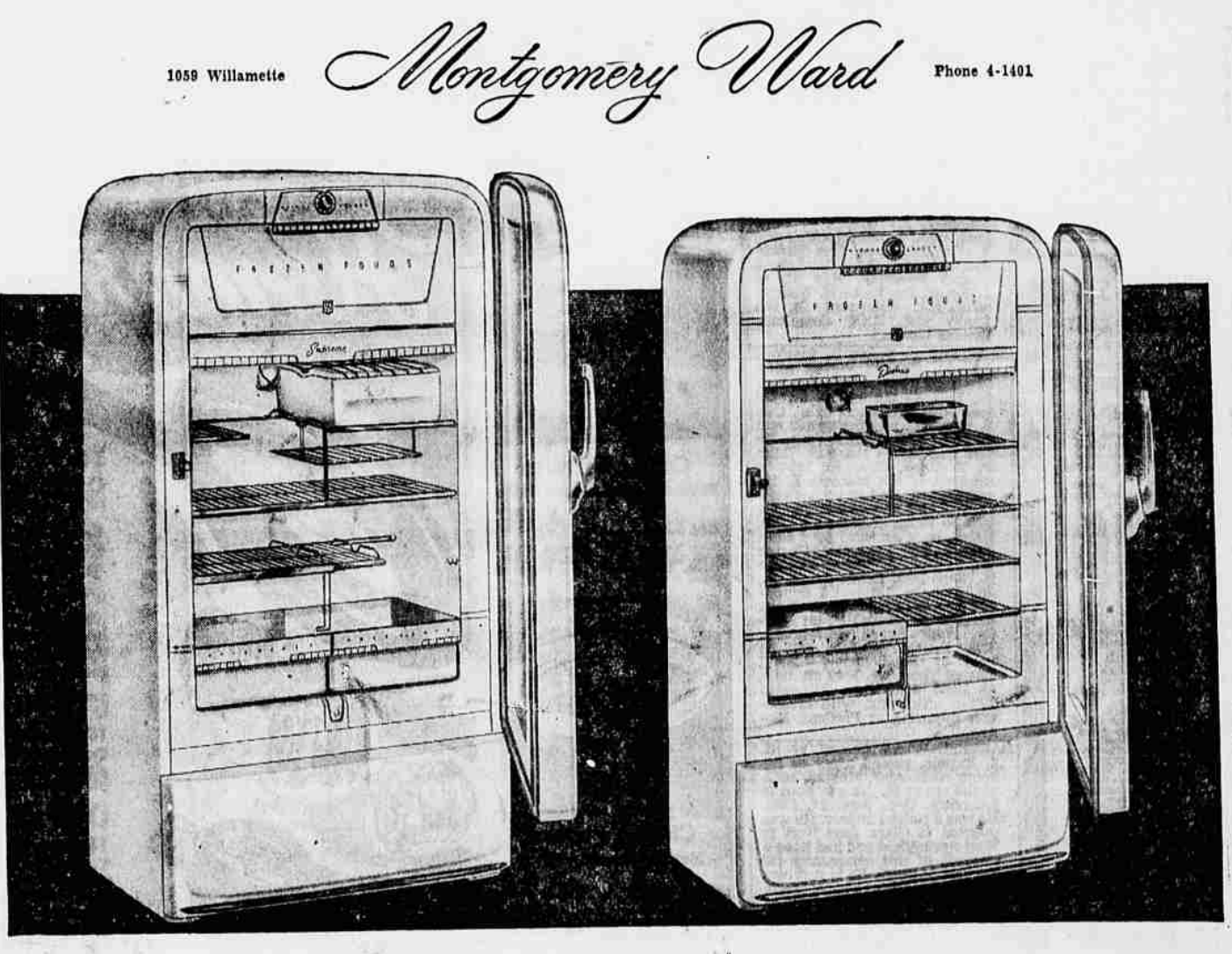

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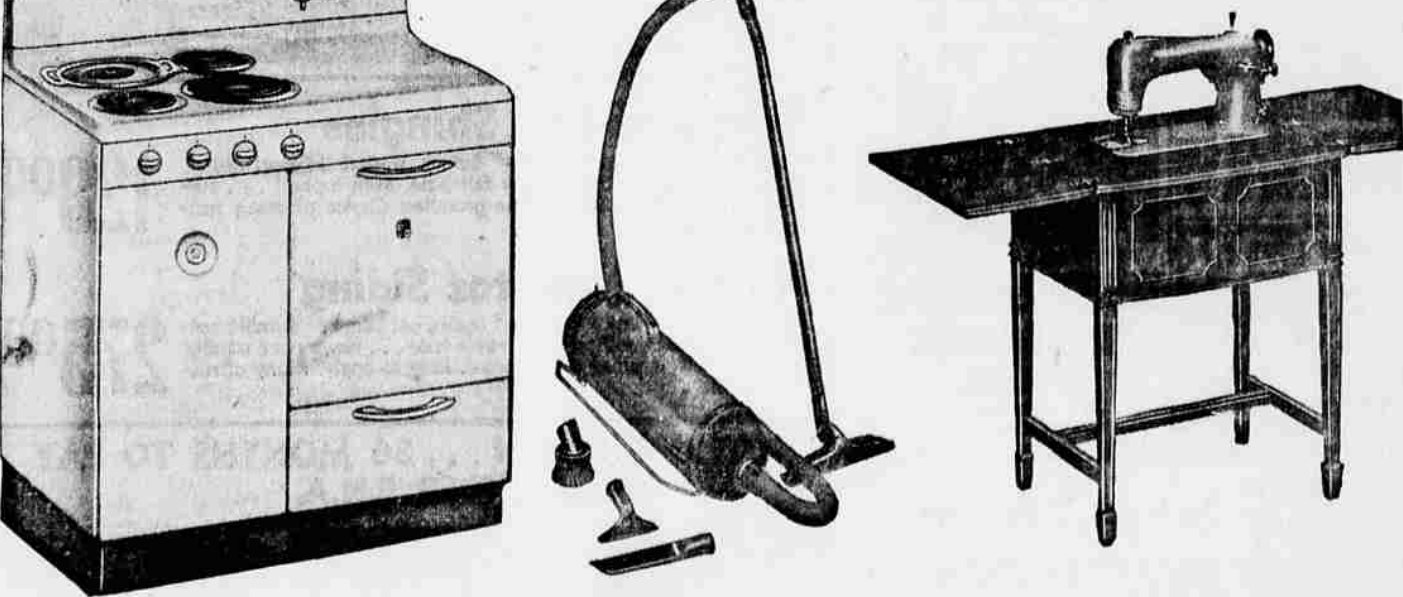
