Treat Shoulders To Beauty Care

The more revealing fashions of the summer season often uncover a back or shoulder full of unsightly blemishes. Here is a beauty ritual which will come to the rescue.

About an hour before bedtime, the blemished areas should be scrubbed with soap and water, rinsed thoroughly and patted dry. A piece of cotton soaked in hot water now goes over these blemished areas. Then a little antiseptic lotion is poured on the cotton and pressed firmly against the eruption. The lotion should remain on the skin overnight.

During adolescence, skin has a tendency to be oily, and when allowed to get dirty, may produce blackheads. Inflamed blackheads become acne or disfiguring pimples. A check on the diet, staying away from rich foods, getting enough rest and fresh air and taking care with skin cleanliness: all are good helps in preventing skin trouble.

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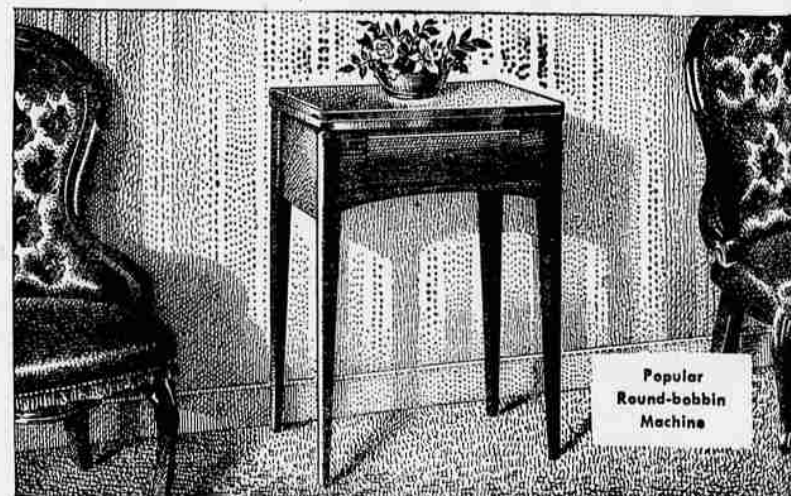
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
