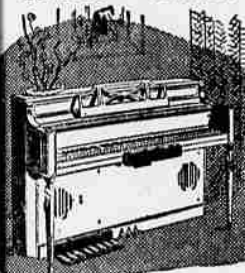

Bethesda Aid Society Lists June Meeting

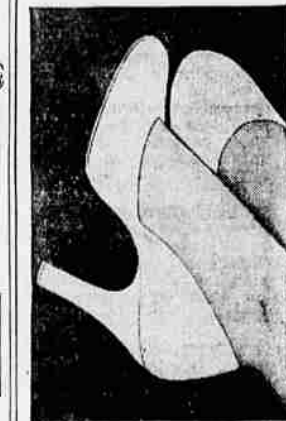
