

Car Jumps Cliff, 3 Men Injured

Old Auto Drops 200 Feet from Road

OAKRIDGE—Three section hands from the Southern Pacific's Fields Station, above Oakridge, were badly bruised and shaken when one received a dislocated right shoulder, in an auto mishap Friday afternoon on a Forest Service road that leads from Fields down a steep course to Highway 58, just below McCredie Springs.

The old-model car was owned and driven by John Willis. It tumbled off the narrow road and fell and bounced 200 feet nearly straight down to the bottom of the canyon. Near the bottom, it bounced completely over a four-foot log with spreading, jagged branches.

Edward Burton, who had the dislocated shoulder, left Willis and Cleveland Clark in the car, and climbed the bank to the road, then walked 2 1/2 miles back up the hill to Fields, arriving at 4:15 p.m., for help. A work train took him to Oakridge, where he was met by the Oakridge ambulance, and taken to Oakridge Clinic for treatment.

In the meantime, the ambulance made a run to the scene of the wreck. Willis was carried up the bank on a stretcher, and volunteers assisted Clark up the bank in a very difficult rescue. All were treated at Oakridge Clinic, and hospitalized in a Southern Pacific bunkhouse at Oakridge.

Court Upholds Treason Charge

WASHINGTON — (AP) — The Supreme Court Monday upheld the treason conviction of Tomoya Kawakita, accused of brutal and inhuman treatment of American prisoners of war while he served as an interpreter at Japan's infamous Camp Oeyama.

Kawakita, born in California of Japanese parents, is under sentence to die in San Quentin prison's gas chamber.

Justice Douglas delivered the 4-3 decision.

Chief Justice Vinson wrote a dissenting opinion in which Justices Black and Burton joined. Justices Frankfurter and Clark dissented themselves from the case.

Kawakita went to Japan with his father in 1939 and remained there throughout the war. He returned to the United States in 1946. One month later he was spotted by a former GI in a Los Angeles department store. FBI agents trailed him and arrested him at his Los Angeles home.

More than 30 ex-servicemen testified against him at his trial in U. S. District Court in Los Angeles.

No execution ever has been carried out in this country for the crime of treason.

Seven university sophomores from Eugene will receive scholarships next year. They are John Harry Akers, Marian Cass, Sally Ann Hayden, Warren Lee Knudson, Martha LaVaun Krueger, Louise Yvonne Reed and Shirley Ann Shupe.

Roseburg Dr. Choice For Top Honor

ROSEBURG — (AP) — Dr. George E. Houck, 86, Roseburg, is the Southern Oregon Medical Society's choice for Oregon Doctor of the Year.

Houck, who has been practicing medicine for more than 60 years, still goes to his office every day. He was in the third graduating class at the state medical school, practiced several years in Central Oregon, then came to Roseburg in 1898. His colleagues credit him with helping pioneer medical advances in Southern Oregon.

He served in World War I, and later was a member of the Roseburg City Council, and mayor of the city. He also served eight years on the State Board of Health.

His name will be offered for the honor at the September meeting of the State Medical Society.

Farmers Invited To Crop Fair

Research Experts
To Explain Plots

A number of Lane County farmers are expected to join Oregon State College's annual Farm Crops Field Day, on June 11, starting at 10 a.m. (DST).

Something a little different is planned this year, according to Dr. D. D. Hill, head of the OSC farm crops department. Instead of taking all visitors on a single tour of the Hyslop farm at Granger, the field day will be operated somewhat like a county fair, he explained. Research experts will be stationed at various points of interest on the farm to explain research plots.

Visitors will receive a map of the farm which is located between Corvallis and Albany, and a brief summary of research projects when they arrive. Then they will be free to come and go as they please, giving farmers a chance to select the projects in which they are most interested.

Among the research projects to be examined are:

- An extensive series of tests with chemicals for control of weeds in grass seed fields.
 - Trials with Krillum, the new soil conditioner.
 - Forage trials including Granger Lotus, strains of white and Ladino clover, fescue seed trials and miscellaneous forage work.
 - Tall fescue breeding.
 - Cereal variety response to treatment with various weed control chemicals.
 - Tests with leaf feeding dust.
 - The effect of fertilizer and cultural practices on yield and quality of malting barley.

Red China Purge Cited by Admiral

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Retired Adm. Charles M. Cooke, Jr., quotes Nationalist Chinese sources as saying ruthless Red purges on the China mainland have taken 15 million lives.

The admiral, who recently returned from two years as technical adviser to the Nationalists on Formosa, said the Communists have executed one million of Chiang Kai-shek's guerrillas during the past 14 months.

Cooke, FORMER U. S. Seventh fleet commander in the Far East, said the bloody purges had reduced the number of active guerrillas to about half a million. Cooke said the figures on executions may be exaggerated but he believed the deaths number in the millions. He added:

"The Communists execute anybody who might be thought would support guerrillas."

"During the last year," Cooke said, "the Communists have killed about one million guerrillas—they have reduced the number by that much — they have killed many more by killing those who could possibly help the guerrillas and all suspected deviationists."

"They have probably killed, altogether, around 15 million Chinese."

In an interview in the weekly news magazine "U.S. News & World Report," the admiral said the United States should help Chiang recapture the mainland.

Old Printer Dies

PORTLAND — (AP) — Thomas G. Warner, 91, father of Oregon Supreme Court Justice Harold J. Warner, died Monday.

Warner was a linotype operator with the Oregon Journal for 35 years until he retired in 1945. Before that he worked on the Pendleton East Oregonian.

Besides his son, Warner is survived by his wife, Kathryn, and two grandchildren, all of Portland.

GOP Delegates Get Invitation

SALEM — (AP) — Oregon's 18 Republican national convention delegates are invited to confer in Denver June 18 with General Eisenhower, William L. Phillips, chairman of the Oregon Eisenhower Committee, said Monday.

The committee will pay the expenses of the delegates, Phillips said.

The Oregon delegation has been allotted 1 1/2 hours for the meeting. The delegation is pledged to support the general because he won the state's presidential Republican primary.

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
