Reedsport Man Killed in Wreck
NORTH BEND—(U.P.) Eugene Brooks, 38, Reedsport, died in a hospital here Thursday from injuries suffered Wednesday in a truck accident on the Loon Lake road east of Reedsport.

Brooks and William Conkey were riding in an empty lumber truck when the shoulder of the road gave way and toppled the truck down a steep slope. Conkey was pinned in the wreckage, but Brooks, who suffered a crushed chest, climbed up the slope to the road and flagged down a passing truck. The truck took Brooks toward Reedsport where an ambulance met him. Conkey escaped with minor injuries.
