Bayly Answers Charge Against Budget Cutting

County Judge Day T. Bayly said Thursday there is not enough work in the Lane County Constable's office for three persons, that two can handle the office adequately.

Bayly's statement was in reference to the budget committee's recent action of shearing funds for an office clerk, effective July 1.

The clerk, Mrs. Mark Hathaway, said Wednesday this office handled a large volume of work and would be handicapped with only two employees.

Present employees include Mark Hathaway, constable, Mark Hathaway Jr., deputy constable, and Mrs. Hathaway.

Bayly said Thursday the matter was discussed fully by the budget committee and it was the committee's opinion two employees were enough.

The "ideal situation," Bayly said, would be either to have the bookwork handled in District Court or through the sheriff's office.

War Casualties Rise Sharply

WASHINGTON — (AP) — Announced U. S. battle casualties in Korea reached 109,712 this week an increase of 553 since last week.

This was the greatest rise reported for any week since last Dec. 12. It reflected the heavier fighting recently. Most of the additional casualties were suffered by the Army and the Marines.

The Defense Department's weekly summary, based on notification to families through last Friday reported: 64 killed in action, bringing the new total to 18,316; 492 wounded, bringing the new total to 79,918; and three missing for a total of 12,478.

The breakdown for casualties by services: Army, 173 killed for an overall total of 68,832; Navy, 15, for 1,375; Air Force, 13 for 1,187; and Marine Corps 382 for 18,316.

Summer Music Clinic Signup Underway

Enrollments for a summer music clinic are being taken this week at the City Hall offices of the Parks and Recreation Bureau.

Students also may sign for the five-week course at the opening session Monday morning in the Eugene High School band room.

Jointly sponsored by the public schools and the Parks Bureau, the clinic will be directed by James C. Martin. Other school music teachers will participate in class instructions for beginning and advanced instrument players, beginners in piano, auto-harp students and a junior chorus.

A fee of \$12.50 is being charged for the courses and instrument rentals may be obtained through local music stores with rates starting as low as \$1 per week.

Anti-Ridgway Rally Fizzles

ROME — (AP) — A Communist-inspired "mass demonstration" against Gen. Matthew B. Ridgway fizzled out in the Italian capital Thursday.

Barely 400 "partisans of peace" turned up for two hours of anti-American harangues. Since the partisans of peace claimed more than a million Romans signed the Stockholm peace appeal, the turnout represented dismal failure.

New virulence marked the Communist press campaign to whip up resistance before the new SHAPE commander pays his first official visit to this Atlantic ally Monday.

Army Psychiatrist Sentenced to Prison

CHICAGO — (AP) — An Army induction center psychiatrist was sentenced to six years in prison Thursday for falsifying records and taking bribes from prospective draftees.

Judge John P. Barnes sentenced Dr. Charles F. Herband, 43, after conviction by a federal court jury.

Herband had been charged with taking bribes totaling \$2,675 from seven selectees. Prosecutors said he had agreed to classify eligible youths as mentally unfit for service.

M. and F. Treasurer Dies in Portland

PORTLAND — (AP) — Ludwig Hirsch, on the Meier and Frank store staff for 71 years, died here Wednesday. He was treasurer of the firm at the time of his death.

Funeral services were set for 3 p.m. Thursday and the store was to be closed from 2 p.m. for the rest of the day.

Hirsch was 87. He became a director of the firm in 1911, 30 years after starting to work there.

4 Atomic Scientists Apparently Uninjured

CHICAGO — (AP) — Four atomic scientists apparently escaped injury when they were over-exposed to deadly nuclear radiation, Billings Memorial Hospital attendants reported Friday.

The scientists, three men and a woman, still are under observation, doctors said, but they probably will be released from the hospital within a short time.

Whittier Order Signed

WASHINGTON — (AP) — President Truman Thursday signed an executive order creating the Whittier defensive sea area in Alaska.

This gives the Defense Department authority to control traffic in Passage Canal, which leads to the military supply port, Whittier.
