Congregational Changes To Summer Plan

At the Congregational Church Sunday Dr. Wesley Goodson Nicholson will preach his last sermon before going on his summer vacation. He will speak on "Issues Facing Churchmen." There will be but one service at 11 a.m. The 9:30 service will be discontinued for the summer and will be resumed on the third Sunday in September.

Sunday at 11 a.m. church school will also be conducted for the departments beginning with the cradle roll and extending through the junior. Junior high young people and high school young people are asked to attend the church service. Thus provision is being made for the family to attend all at one time.

Dr. and Mrs. Nicholson will leave Monday morning to attend the meetings of the general council of Congregational churches in Claremont, Calif., beginning Wednesday, June 18, and continuing through Wednesday, June 25. Following they will vacation in southern California visiting friends whom they have not seen since coming to Eugene nine years ago. They will make their headquarters while on their vacation at the home of the Rev. and Mrs. Fred Niedringhaus of Santa Ana, Calif. In Dr. Nicholson's absence the pulpit will be supplied by four Congregational laymen: Dr. William C. Jones, Dr. Charles Schleicher, Dr. Robert Clark and Dr. Frederick Hunter. Further announcement about the services will be made. Dr. Nicholson plans to return for the Sunday of July 20.

Religious Liberty Is Theme For Rally Speaker

Dr. Clyde W. Taylor, executive director of the Evangelical Foreign Missionary Association, is to be the featured speaker at a rally here according to announcement by Dr. Vance H. Webster, pastor of the First Baptist Church, in charge of the arrangements.

The meeting is Friday, June 20, 7:45 p.m., in the Lighthouse Temple, 12th and Olive Sts., Eugene. The theme of "Religious Liberty" will be stressed with emphasis on conditions in Colombia, Spain, and Italy, and American religious liberty.

Dr. Taylor's experience includes three terms as a missionary in South America. Professor of Gordon College of Theology and Missions, and pastor of evangelical churches. At the present time he holds the dual position of executive director of the Evangelical Foreign Missionary Association and secretary of affairs of the National Association of Evangelicals.
