

Church to Start \$300,000 Drive for New School

\$100,000 of Total To Pay Off Debt

St. Mary's Catholic church next month will undertake a drive to raise \$300,000 to clear the old debt and to replace the old wooden building, the Very Rev. Edmund J. Murnane announced this week.

Murnane said \$100,000 of the subscription the group will raise will go to pay off the old debt. The remaining \$200,000 will be used to build a new brick structure. The parish hoped to build a new building on a pay-as-you-go basis and to avoid going into debt.

WOODEN building at 11th and Lincoln was built in 1907 at the time the church was founded. It was replaced in 1920 and a wing was added to it in its new location. The replacement will face Lincoln and will join the present brick building of the school. The school then extend the full block between 10th and 11th, Murnane said.

Organized by the parish 63 years ago, the school last year accommodated 639 students. Ten years ago the enrollment was 222. The frame building, used under temporary permit, last school year housed seven grades and 100 students. Father Murnane said the new building, designed by Jacobberger and Stanton of Portland, will be a two-story fireproof building of brick, stone, granite and steel.

First floor of the new building will contain four classrooms, with wardrobes, administrative offices, a reception room, a gymnasium, an auditorium-gymnasium which will double as a cafeteria, and a kitchen. A fully equipped stage will be available for entertainment and forums.

Four classrooms, a teachers' lounge and library will be on the second floor. The cafeteria and gymnasium in the present brick building will be renovated into additional classrooms.

St. Mary's, a fully accredited school, has a teaching staff of a principal, 12 teaching Sisters, two lay teachers, and three men who devote full time to the education. All teachers meet requirements of certification. The Mothers' Club operates a lunch program.

Bethel Board Meets Monday

Teachers, better lights and lavatory facilities will come to the attention of Bethel School board members at their meeting at the Bethel Administration Bldg. Monday night.

Superintendent Tom Powers said the board would probably approve five new teachers and accept resignations. In addition, he said a second grade teacher position is still open.

Board members will open bids for lighting the Bethel Elementary School, at which lighting has been judged sub-standard by the Board of Education. Construction of more lavatory facilities at Danebo School will also be discussed, Powers said.

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Hiccupping Jack O'Leary Still Shaken With Spasms: 1 a Second

GLENDAL, Calif. — (UP) — Five years ago Saturday former grocery clerk Jack O'Leary, 27, started hiccupping — and he's still shaken once every second with the spasms.

During those five years many things have occurred; the world has not stood still. Fighting broke out in Korea. But O'Leary, a gaunt 77 pounds in weight, still is fighting to get rid of the hiccupping.

Thousands of remedies have been suggested to him and dozens have been tried, with almost no effect.

Among those O'Leary has not tried were the suggestions to shoot himself in his big toe with a gun to produce a remedial shock. He also has not jumped out of a second-story window as advised by another well-meaning person.

But the youth who once weighed 135 pounds has taken injections, medicine by mouth, tried hypnosis, therapy, massage, electric shocks, hot compresses, ether and chloroform.

And still he hiccups. Although he looks almost like a human skeleton and has big, black circles under his eyes, O'Leary has not given up hope. "I'll lick this year," he vowed grimly as he polished automobiles.

O'Leary is trying to earn enough money to return to Grants Pass, Ore., where several weeks ago a physician administered treatments which gave some indication that they might help. They helped him retain food 40 minutes instead of 20 minutes.

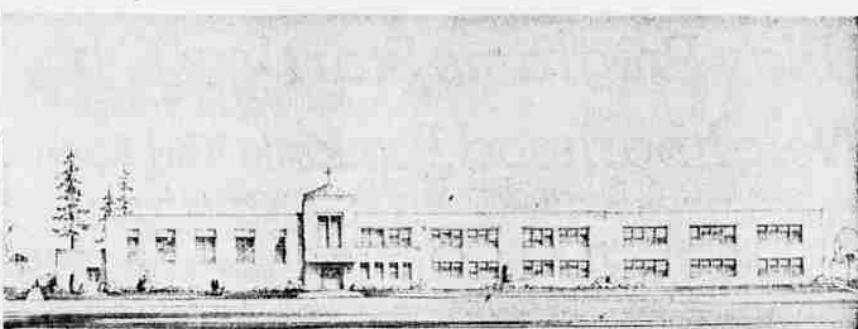
He plans to return to Oregon in a month and remain there

long enough to learn if the injection treatments actually will do the job.

For a brief spell last year, O'Leary did stop hiccupping while he was in Arizona. But he returned to the coast after doctors said the relief was only temporary and his condition might become worse in time.

The hiccupping dates back to a ruptured appendix. And since the spasms started O'Leary has received more than 40,000 letters and numerous packages from all over the world with remedies, including one from Emperor Hirohito's private physician.

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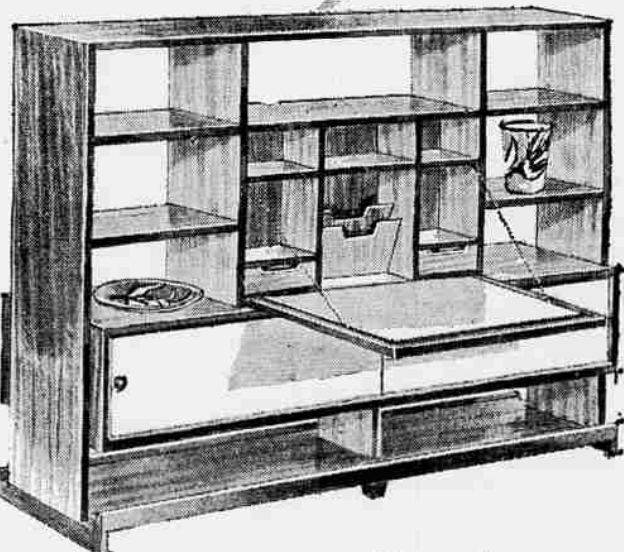

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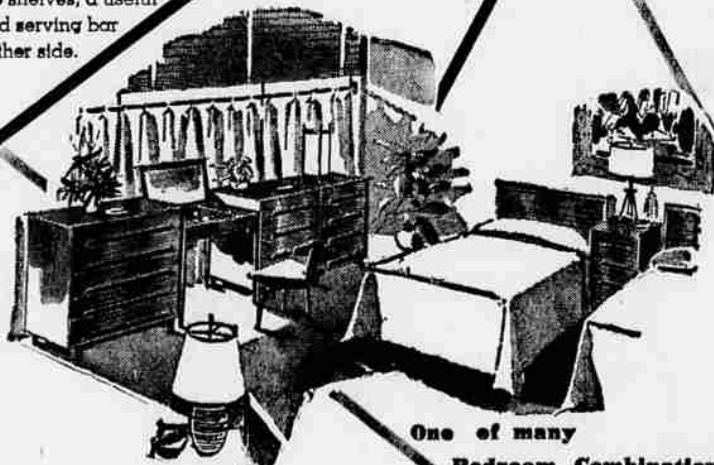
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
