

Gets 64 1/2% of State Vote 68.94% of Voters Ballot

Gen. Eisenhower received 64 1/2 per cent of the vote in the Republican Presidential election a month ago, and California Gov. Warren is the overwhelming choice of the state's voters for vice president.

The official vote for the Republican delegates to the convention was announced Monday by Dave Latta, chief of the State Election Division.

Warren's 18 Republican delegates will be pledged to support an Eisenhower-Warren ticket when the convention meets in Chicago July 7.

Eisenhower received 172,486 votes, while Warren placed second with 164,747, or 16.47 per cent.

The Associated Press poll before the election gave Eisenhower 61 per cent of the vote, about 3 1/2 per cent less than he received.

The poll gave Warren 18 per cent, less than 1 per cent off the actual vote.

Third place was Gen. MacArthur with 18,503, or 8.96 per cent. Sen. Taft, whose name was on the ballot, received 17,100 write-in votes, or 6.74 per cent.

The fifth man on the list is Wayne Morse, who got 7,105, or 3.4 per cent. Next was Harold Gilliam with 6,610, or 2.47 per cent.

The low man is William R. Schneider, St. Louis lawyer, with only 350 votes.

Gen. MacArthur, Morse and Taft were unwilling candidates in the state primary.

In the vice presidential balloting, all done by write-in, Warren got 22,467 votes, while Stassen ran second with 3,815. Others were Morse, 2,221; MacArthur, 1,676; Taft, 947; Eisenhower, 406; and Thomas E. Dewey, 148.

There were 267,310 votes cast for president, or 68.94 per cent of the number of registered voters. This total was slightly larger than had been expected by political observers, who had forecast a 66 per cent vote.

O'HARA ALSO announced the vote for Republican Party offices. Jesse Gard, Portland, was elected National Committeeman with 79,451 votes. Others in the race were Lowell C. Paget, Portland, 62,992; Charles L. Paine, Portland, 57,808; and Glenn R. Jack, Oregon City, 44,677.

Mrs. Marshall E. Cornett, Klamath Falls, was re-elected Republican National Committeewoman without opposition. She got 176,664 votes.

Those elected as the 10 Republican delegates at large were: Gov. Douglas McKay; Sen. Morse; Lamar Tooez, Portland; Robert A. Elliott, Medford; Howard C. Bell, Canby; Gordon Orput, Portland; William McAllister, Medford; Mark O. Hatfield, Salem; J. O. Johnson, Tigard; and Frank E. Fowler, Astoria.

THE UNOFFICIAL totals immediately after election showed that Leslie M. Scott and Zylpha Zell Burns, both Portland, had been elected, but the official figures replaced them with Johnson and Fowler.

Delegates elected from congressional districts were:

First, Carl W. Hogg and Mrs. James W. Mott, both Salem; Second, H. H. DeArmond, Bend, and Howard Dent Jr., The Dalles; Third, Tommy Luke and John Morgan, both Portland; Fourth, Lars P. Peterson and William E. Walsh, both Coos Bay.

O'Hara said the rest of the election results would be announced during the next few days.

Science Now Hopes to Convert H-Bomb

WASHINGTON (AP) — Now the blinding at hydrogen power, has long been known that some atomic energy can be converted to produce power. Witness the atomic submarine, the keel of which was laid at Groton, Conn., Saturday.

Scientists generally have the sort of atomic energy that will be unleashed when the atom is split, never used for peace.

A paragraph in a speech by Sen. Brien McMahon (Conn.) suggests, however, that hydrogen reaction of the "supernova" can be harnessed.

"There is now hope," he said, "that possibly there may develop a science—important peacetime applications of hydrogen principle."

McMahon is chairman of the Senate Atomic Energy Committee. It is privy to all the secrets. If it wants to hear them, the U.S. atomic energy project, which was hatched at the committee office refused to let "peacetime applications" be hinted at. If he had power, the prospects would be almost limitless.

Atomic energy is released when splitting of the uranium atom. H-bomb is released by fusion welding of the nuclei of hydrogen.

A means of unlocking the enormous energy frozen in the atom, fusion is many times more efficient than fission.

One reason the H-bomb is used is that it is vastly more powerful—pound for pound, than an A-bomb.

How would you go about harnessing hydrogen energy for non-military uses? Science has been saying for years that the multi-million-degree heat of the A-bomb can trigger hydrogen fusion reaction.

LRB Plans Shipping Talks

FRANCISCO (AP) — National Labor Relations Board officials planned to meet separately with shipowners and labor this week in an effort to end the 22-day strike of the AFL Sailors Union of the Pacific.

The dispute has tied up some vessels in West Coast ports. The sailors ask a five per cent increase and overtime for days at sea.

Shipowners, through the Maritime Association, refuse to discuss wages until the union agrees to a one-year contract with a no strike pledge, instead of a contract which may be terminated on 60 days' notice, as now.

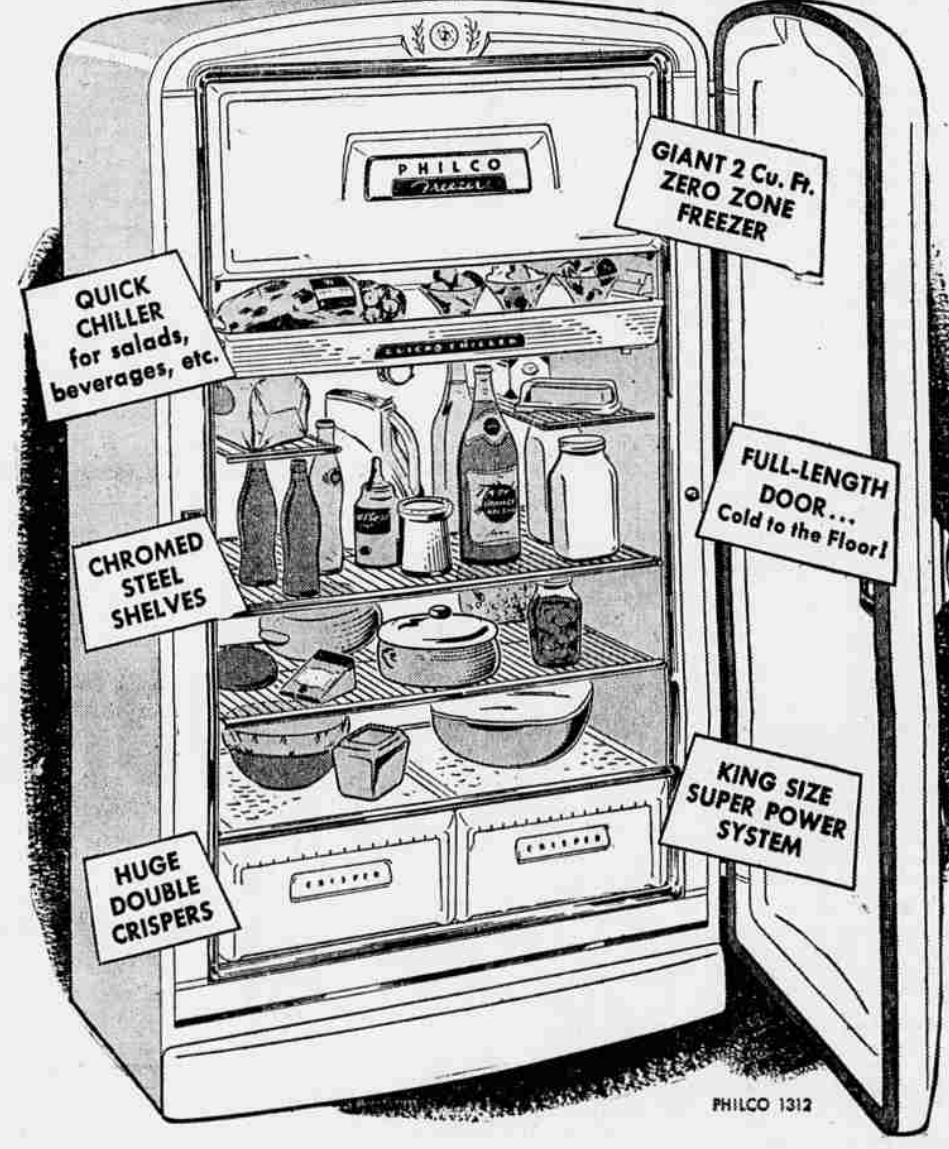

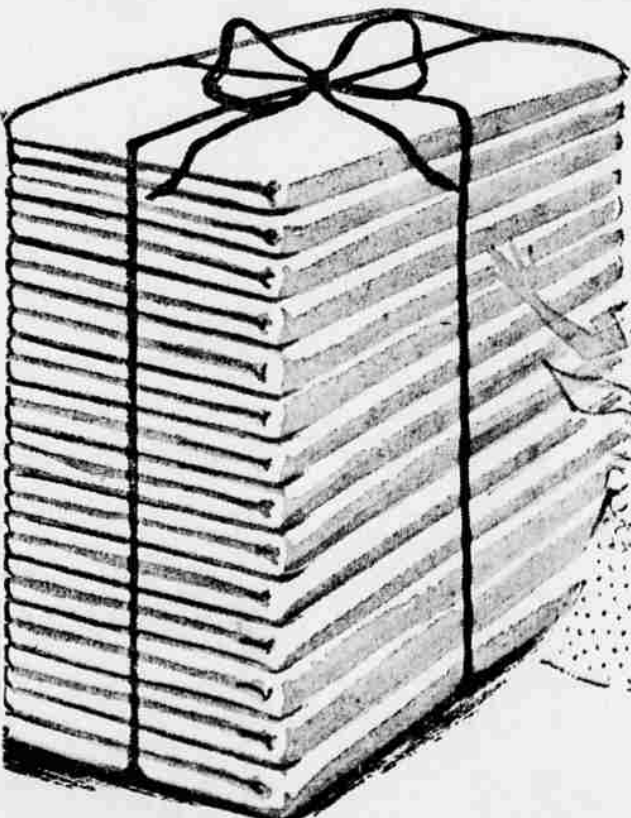
