

Red Assaults Thrown Back Commies Suffer Heavy Casualties

SEOUL, Korea — (AP) — United Nations forces hurled back sporadic Communist assault in East-Central Korea Thursday and killed more than one-fourth of the attacking battalion.

U.S. Eighth Army headquarters estimated 200 Red soldiers were killed as air-supported Allied troops successfully defended their forward position southeast of Kumsong.

FOR THE SECOND successive day Red guns were silent near the Allies' newly won T-shaped hill mass west of Chorwon on the Western Front. U. S. Shooting Stars made eight air strikes on Reds still dug in on the rocky ridge.

The Chinese Communists' Kumsong assault began with fire from six self-propelled tanks or guns Wednesday night. Then five infantry platoons attacked and before dawn the Reds upped their strength to around a battalion, about 750 men.

After light exchanges of small arms, mortar and artillery fire, U.N. soldiers crippled a nighttime attack with their own counter-assault.

GROUNDING by bad weather Wednesday, Fifth Air Force fighter bombers reappeared Thursday on close support missions against frontline Reds on both the Chorwon and Kumsong sectors.

One flight of Allied Shooting Stars killed or wounded 75 Communists and shot up three caves reported shielding Red soldiers, the Air Force said. Land-based Marine planes attacked a Red supply building 20 miles north of P'yonggang, on the Central Front.

No Harsh Words At Truce Session

MUNSAN, Korea — (AP) — Not a single official word was exchanged Thursday at Panmunjon in the second day of a three-day recess the United Nations command called in the stalled Korean truce negotiations.

By nightfall the Communists had not even asked for a meeting of liaison officers. These officers met daily during an Allied-called recess last week.
