

Army's Ruling May Hurt Ike

WASHINGTON — (U.P.) — The Department's refusal to qualify Gen. Douglas MacArthur as Republican keynote speaker recalls that Sen. Robert Taft is President Truman's candidate for the GOP presidential nomination.

Truman has said so, and MacArthur's keynote speech to nominate Taft and to stop Dwight D. Eisenhower, as one of Ike's friends fear, the ruling was that since MacArthur had no military assignment at the moment, he was free to make political speeches despite the fact that he is technically on active service as a five star general.

THE FACTS ARE, however, Eisenhower's friends and others put the Army on an impossible spot with suggestions that MacArthur was not qualified to make a political speech before a convention or anywhere else.

IT'S GOING to remain a secret, too—a Texas secret—for Shelly isn't talking.

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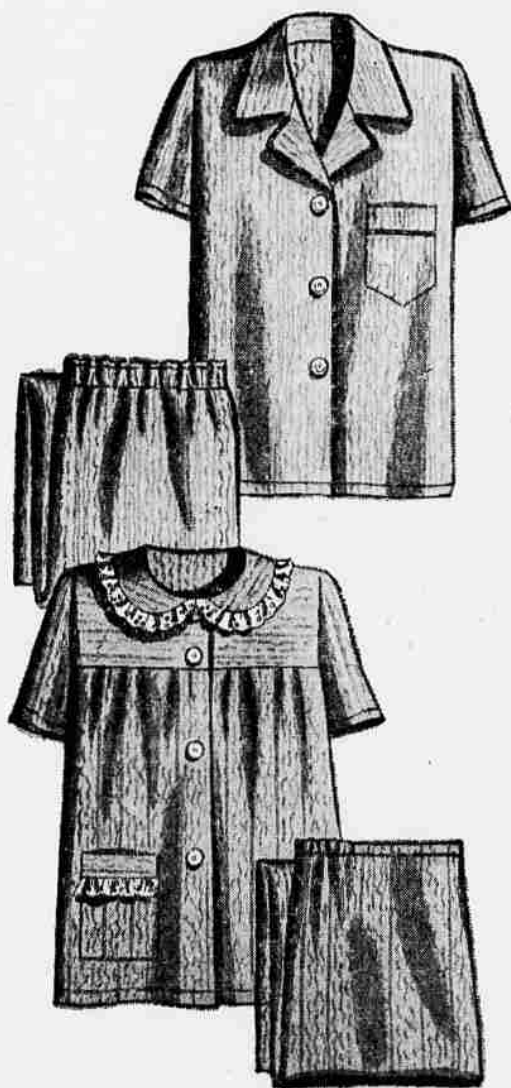
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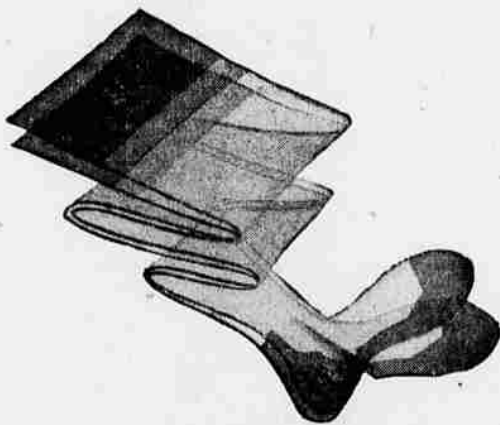
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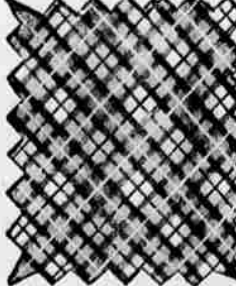
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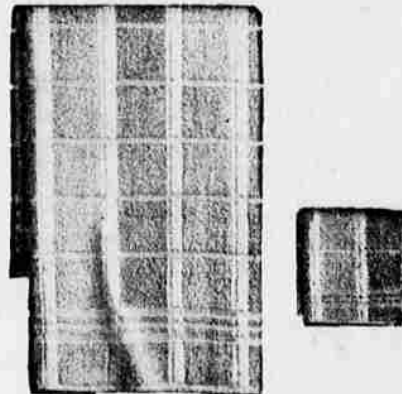
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
