Learn-to-Swim Campaigns Scheduled by Red Cross

The biggest Red Cross swim program ever presented in Lane County opened this week for Springfield youngsters. More than 200 enrolled the first day at the Springfield pool, and when enrollment is completed the class is expected to number about 500.

Meanwhile, the Red Cross office announced plans for swim programs in other parts of the county. Following the Springfield program, which will run four weeks, youngsters from Junction City and Coburg areas will have a three-week course from 9 to 12 a.m. at the Springfield pool. Four Red Cross swim instructors will be on duty.

THE PROGRAM for Fall Creek, Lowell, Dexter, Jasper, and surrounding area will open June 23. Mrs. J. B. Palmer, Fall Creek, is chairman.

Another program opening June 23 will be one at Cleawox Lake for Florence area residents. Mrs. Dan Buckley is chairman. The program will last until July 4. Instructing will be Jack Dante and Arthur Coit, who are now attending National Red Cross Aquatic School at Prescott, Ariz.

The Cottage Grove program will open at 1 p.m. July 7, and end July 26. Classes will be at Wilson Creek, with Bob Dusenberry in charge. Red Cross instructors will assist.

Dates for the Triangle Lake classes have been set tentatively for July 7. Mrs. Vera Christianson, Mrs. Hazel McVay and Mrs. Harry Shaw will arrange the program.

Separate swim programs may be conducted at Mapleton and Swishhome this year. Other years children from these areas have attended classes at Cleawox. More details will be announced later. Howard Peckham, Swishhome, is chairman for the area.

Fern Ridge swimmers will begin classes Monday, June 23 at Inman Landing on the John Jeans property. The location is off the Old Elmira Road on the Southeast corner of the lake. The residents of all Route F and Fern Ridge area will be welcome. Mrs. Max Weiss, Red Cross chairman for Rt. F, will have charge. Assisting are Mrs. Glen Gould, Mrs. Gogge, Elmira women assisting are Mrs. Helen Stanley and Mrs. May Darcy. Roy Christianson and Ray Swanson will help with supervision. Bill Williams, and Dean and Dixie Sheldon will instruct. Classes start at noon.

Dates for the Marcola, Wendling and Mable area program will be announced. Mrs. Robert Myers is chairman. Classes will be taught in an area in back of her home.

Dates for the oakridge, Westfir and Willamette City swim classes will also be announced. Classes will be at Salmon Creek. Mrs. D. D. Cooper will be chairman, and Mrs. Raymond Clark is signing up mothers who will help supervise.

Instructors will be Ron Whitecliff, Edna Scruby and Jean Hodges.

Mrs. Martha Belknap is chairman of the McKenzie program, which will open Aug. 4. Full details will be announced.

Max Strauss, Junction City, chairman of the county swim program, pointed out that water at all swim areas must be tested pure by the health department before classes are considered.

Without the help of school boards and parents, the classes could not be conducted, he said. School buses are used in almost every case for transportation of students. Parents take turns in supervising the children on the buses and at the swim area. Some communities have built needed sanitary facilities at swim areas.

since Red Cross regulations demand that these be available before classes can be taught in any area.

The Lane County chapter this year sent seven men and women to the Aquatic School in Arizona to perfect their teaching techniques. All of these will teach at some of the programs listed during the summer.

Attending the school are Max Strauss, Jack Dante, Arthur Coit, Sue Shreve, Edna Scruby, Don Whitecliff, and Janet Palmer.

PURPOSE of the program is to teach swimming to all children who can possibly be enrolled, and at no cost, Strauss declared. Many drownings can be avoided if more children learn to swim early, he believes.

This year there will be 15 different learn-to-swim campaigns in the county. Any persons, six to sixty, is welcome to attend the program closest to him.
