Adventure Among Shadows

This is the season of baccalaureate sermons and commencement addresses. Youth, emerging from its brief period of academic seclusion and draft deferment, girds itself for a world bristling with challenges.

In such an atmosphere, unctuous platitudes carry small conviction. That may account for the sober and almost gloomy note in some of the current addresses to graduating classes.

One of the major purposes of education is to lift the gaze above the immediate present, to discover the riches of the past and the possibilities of the future.

President A. Whitney Griswold of Yale last week end deplored the failure of the American public to recognize this fact. He cited as symptoms of the "sickness" of American education the present financial crisis, the teacher shortages, overcrowded and undisciplined schoolrooms, threats to academic freedom.

What can this mean to the young man called on to leave the school of liberal arts for the rougher school of mass slaughter? It can mean that he is challenged to carry into

the great, machinelike, collective enterprises of our day that faith in intelligence, that sense of the dignity and worth of the individual, that awareness of the spiritual resources of mankind that holds out hope for the triumph of mental and moral power over brute force.

Shakespeare put into the mouth of his would-be dictator, Julius Caesar, words known to almost every schoolboy:

Let me have men about me that are fat; Sleek-headed men, and such a sleep 'o' night; Yon Cassius has a lean and hungry look; He thinks too much: such men are dangerous.

Today subversive plotters of the Cassius type are to be found in American society; but an equal or even greater danger may exist in the tendency to use this as an excuse to decry independent thought, to suspect the man who "thinks too much," who rises too far above the average.

Yet, as the students at New York University were reminded by the Rev. Dr. Louis W. Pitt last Sunday, religion holds the answer insofar as it satisfies "not only the desire for safety but also the spirit of adventure." Here religion and education join hands.

To think adventurously and creatively toward the peace for which the whole world longs is the privilege and obligation of every young man and woman, who steps out among the shadows of today.

Are you for or agin' legal gambling? Whoever is the case, Oregon must decide this important question, so signatures from those of both opinions serve the same purpose, to get the question before the voters on the November ballot.

Most churches are energetically circulating petitions this weekend to place a measure on

the ballot, under sponsorship of the Oregon Council of Churches. The Rev. Chas. Epple, pastor of United Lutheran Church, is in charge.
