Governor to Attend Firm Opening

PORTLAND—Gov. Douglas McKay of Oregon will lead a group of state and local officials and business leaders at ceremonies Friday morning officially opening American Can Company's newest paper milk container manufacturing plant.

Headed by Governor McKay, the dignitaries will throw switches which will formally set in operation the container plant.

Among those scheduled to participate in the ceremonies, in addition to Governor McKay, are: Dorothy McCullough Lee, mayor of Portland; R. F. Hepenstal, of New York, vice president in charge of the firm's Pacific division; A. T. Augensen, division manager of manufacture; A. C. Staley Jr., division manager of sales; Stanley J. Hartmann, Portland plant manager; E. G. Gross, Oregon district sales manager, and L. D. Jenkins, Washington district sales manager.

CELEBRATE TWO DAYS
The plant-opening celebration will extend over two days. The first day's activities, besides the formal start of production, will be highlighted by an employees' "Family Night" reception from 7 to 10:00 p.m., featuring tours of the plant for plant employees in the Portland area, their relatives and friends.

Climaxing the two-day event will be an "Open House" for the general public Saturday. Souvenirs and refreshments will be provided.

The paper container unit, when in full operation, will employ more than 100 men and women from the Portland area. It is located at Canco's Portland metal container factory at 2127 N.W. 26th avenue.

Roberts pointed out that the company's Portland plant has an average employment of nearly 500 people. It produces cans for fruit, vegetable, fish and berry canning industries.

LARGE TANKS INSTALLED
Plant Manager Hartmann stated that in addition to modern, high-speed paper milk container lines, large tanks and pumping stations have been installed for receipt, storage, heating and dispensing of paraffin for coating the insides and outsides of the fibre cartons.

He added that provisions have been made for future expansion of the fibre container unit which has an annual rated capacity of 200 million containers for quart, pint and half-pint sizes.

'Mystery Man' Grunewald Again Defies Court Subpoena, Risking Heavy Jail Sentence

NEW YORK (AP)—Mystery man Henry Grunewald again defied a federal subpoena Wednesday, risking a possible jail sentence.

When the Washington mystery man failed to appear in a Brooklyn Federal Court Judge Matthew T. Abruzzo directed Grunewald to appear voluntarily next Tuesday or appear under arrest Aug. 28.

Grunewald also failed to answer a subpoena last Friday to testify before a federal grand jury investigating tax office corruption. He was scheduled to appear today to show cause why he should not be held in contempt for failing to answer a grand jury subpoena.

The mystery man's physician, Dr. John J. Curry, Washington, told the judge today he had "forbidden Grunewald to testify."

"I'm practically certain his appearance here would endanger his life, the doctor said."

Judge Abruzzo said he would have to overrule the doctor. "What happens after he, Grunewald, gets here is another story," the judge said.

"Stop playing with me," he told the physician. "I don't like it. You don't know what would happen if he appears before the grand jury. You wouldn't know until after he appears."

"He's got to come to Brooklyn," Judge Abruzzo said. He has defied my order. I want to talk to him personally here in this court and see how he looks. If he doesn't come peacefully I'll send a marshal to bring him here under a body attachment."

Police Drop Time Petitions

SALEM (AP)—Salem police have virtually dropped their attempts to get petition signers for a 40-hour week; measure and firemen have discarded many of the petitions they have circulated the past several weeks.

The two groups of city employees suspended their petition campaign after the city attorney and the Salem Civil Service Commission both ruled that petition circulating by city employees was illegal and that members of the police force and fire department faced dismissal unless the activity stopped.

Firemen said they believed they still had about 1,200 names on petitions which have been circulated by friends outside the civil service. They said many new helpers joined the wives of firemen in circulating petitions.

S. P. Stevens, Portland, a vice president of the International Association of Firefighters, said at a meeting with firemen Tuesday, that in his long experience with the association he had never heard of firemen being prevented from circulating a petition on such a matter.

The collective bargaining measure would be a charter amendment that would have to get voter approval in the November election. It affects both firemen and policemen.

Rogue Valley Pear Harvest Underway

MEDFORD (AP)—The Rogue River Valley's Bartlett pear harvest is being carried on actively in all orchards now.

The yield is expected to be 23,000 tons, about 20 per cent under last year's figure and 15 per cent below normal.

The later varieties of pear, which make up the biggest part of the region's fruit crop will be harvested about two weeks from now.
